What is a Charitable Organization Endowment?

A charitable organization endowment is a permanent fund that generates annual income for the benefit of a charitable organization. Our investment and distribution policies take into consideration that these funds need to provide income to the organizations for years to come. With more than 320 endowment funds benefiting charitable organizations, our program is the largest of its type in the United States. See pages 5-10 for the complete list.

In addition to the annual distribution, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation also provides the following services to organizations with endowment funds:

Fund Management and Administration - We process all gifts and gift acknowledgements and provide each organization with an annual report of their fund(s) including gifts, distributions and investment performance. In addition, organizations are provided with a customized notebook with program policies and fund agreements.

Development, Communications and Training - We promote all endowment funds through publications and our website. Organizations also receive our monthly E News featuring timely articles on nonprofit topics, and we offer free seminars on planned giving and other charitable issues.

GiveSmartOKC.org - The website is a partnership with GuideStar and is a powerful online resource designed to encourage informed charitable giving in central Oklahoma. Details about financials, governance and programming that is provided by nonprofit organizations and vetted by our staff is bringing a new level of transparency to anyone interested in charitable giving.



Lunch for 2 - In partnership with Cole & Reed, P.C., we offer a free workshop for CPAs that work with charitable organizations. The quarterly luncheon provides continuing education credits.

Central Oklahoma Charities - Each program participant is featured on our online directory at occf.org/CentralOklahomaCharities with an individual web page that includes contact information, website links and a link to make an online gift to the organization's endowment.

Donor Central - Participants have 24-7 access to an online fund reporting service at occf.org/DonorCentral that provides endowment fund balances, gift and annual distribution history and quarterly investment performance.

The Toolkit - The online toolkit at occf.org/toolkit features resources to help organizations build and promote their endowment funds.

Planned Giving Services - We work with organizations and their donors to facilitate a variety of planned gifts that will benefit their endowment funds. In addition, program participants can utilize our online planned giving resource LegacyGiving at OCCFLegacy.org.

Online Giving - Charitable organizations can provide donors with the opportunity to make a secure, online gift to their endowment fund using any major credit card at occf.org/OnlineGiving.

Our Spending Policy: Striking the Right Balance

Of primary importance to any permanent endowment program is a prudent approach to how the annual distribution amount is calculated. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation’s approach is to have a spending policy in place that provides a structured method of making annual distributions from an endowment fund. The spending policy protects the distribution amount from inflation, provides a predictable annual distribution and allows our Investment Committee and investment managers to focus on maximizing total investment return.

Since 1989, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation has employed a spending policy that is designed to permit funds to capitalize on good investment years as well as protect in the event of a low or negative return market. The economic volatility we experienced several years ago, where returns were on both extremes of investment performance, supports the wisdom of a spending policy that stabilizes the effects of market conditions on annual distribution from an endowment.

Annual distributions from the majority of permanent endowment funds administered by the Oklahoma City Community Foundation are based on a spending policy that distributes 5 percent of the fund’s average market value for the previous 12 quarters as of March 31. The remaining investment return remains in the fund to add to the value, thus building the fund value and protecting the future distribution stream from inflation. The annual distribution from the fund is more predictable because the amount is not tied to current income that fluctuates due to shifts in market conditions. Instead, the annual distribution is based on a rolling quarter average of the fund’s market value. Initially, the number of quarters used was eight but was changed to 12 quarters in 2011 to further stabilize the flow from stock market fluctuations.

We are pleased to report that the investment performance total return for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 is 14.56 percent. Please visit occf.org/InvestmentManagement for quarterly investment performance results.

“Large educational and institutional endowment managers across the country regard the 5 percent spending policy as a standard and a safe amount to distribute while still protecting the principal,” says Nancy B. Anthony, president, Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

The 5 percent figure is based upon an estimate of two factors: market return and inflation. A conservative prediction of average market return over time is 8 percent while it is expected that inflation would average 3 percent over time. This leaves 5 percent to spend while still protecting the fund’s value for the future.

While there are other approaches to determining distributions, the 5 percent spending rule does not require a specific investment allocation to income producing assets and is not subject to short-term market fluctuations. The spending policy also allows our investment managers to focus on achieving the best total return.

“The total return concept is especially important because of our goal of growing endowment funds,” Anthony says. “There is an available annual distribution of 5 percent from an endowment fund that is increasing in value over time even if there are no additional donor contributions to the fund.”

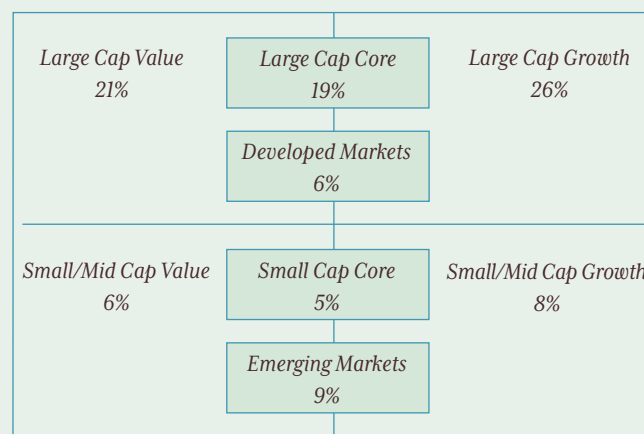

Advised Funds Can Create a Family Legacy

Advised Funds are the simplest and most flexible way for an individual or family to accomplish their charitable goals. We offer three options and each one can be established with a gift of cash or other assets.

With a minimum balance of \$10,000, a **Legacy Fund** offers both our proven investment management as well as the handling of all required reporting and administrative details. Additional benefits include:

- It's a permanent endowment with an annual spendable amount.
- Low competitive fees.
- The spendable balance allows for grants to be recommended at any time to any charitable organization within the United States.
- Donor has online access to fund and grant reports and can also make grant recommendations online.
- Anonymous grant making is available.
- Favorable tax treatment compared to private foundations.
- An expert staff is available to advise and provide all administrative support.

A **Gift Fund** is established with a minimum of \$10,000, and is a more effective alternative to commercial gift funds. Additional benefits include:

- Fund balance is completely spendable.
- Low competitive fees.

- Grants can be recommended at any time to any charitable organization.
- Donor has online access to fund and grant reports and can also make grant recommendations online.
- Anonymous grant making is available.
- Favorable tax treatment compared to private foundations.
- An expert staff is available to advise and provide all administrative support.

The **Express Fund** can be established with a minimum of \$1,000 and offers the following benefits:

- Fund balance is completely spendable.
- No investment earnings are allocated to the fund.
- A nominal fee of up to 1 percent is charged on contributions at the time of the gift.
- Grants can be recommended at any time to any charitable organization.
- Fund balance reports are available.
- Anonymous grant making is available.

Giving now: Your Options

Cash Gifts: A cash contribution to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation can be in the form of cash, check, money order or a cashier's check. You can mail a cash contribution to: Oklahoma City Community Foundation, P.O. Box 1146, Oklahoma City, OK 73101-1146.

You may also make a gift with a major credit card via our secure online giving system at www.occf.org/onlinegiving.

Real Estate: Real estate may be given at appraised value. If appreciated, capital gain taxes may be avoided on the real estate appreciation if the property is contributed to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

Business-related Assets: We accept gifts of individually-owned business assets such as closely-held C-corp. and S-corp. stock, partnerships and LLCs.

Stocks and Bonds: Donating marketable or closely-held securities, such as stocks and bonds, offer you the ability to realize significant tax savings while maximizing your charitable contributions by providing income tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding the capital gains tax on those donated assets. We have accounts at many brokerage firms and can facilitate the transfer of donors' securities.

Oil and Gas Interests & Royalty Interests: Both oil & gas working interests and royalty interests may be donated to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

Giving later: Your Options

Charitable Gift Annuities: Through a charitable gift annuity (CGA), a donor makes a gift with cash or other assets, receives income for life and, at the end of the annuity, the remaining assets will go to the charitable funds of the donor's choosing.

Bequests: With a bequest, you can designate a percentage, the residual or your entire estate to benefit an existing charitable fund and it may provide your family with substantial reductions in federal estate taxes.

Retirement Plan Assets: Retirement plan assets are subject not only to estate taxes, but also income taxes. You can use retirement plan assets to maximize your charitable contributions by establishing an advised fund.

Charitable Remainder Trusts: A charitable remainder trust allows you to place assets in a trust that pays you or a beneficiary an annual income. Upon the trust's termination, the remaining assets will benefit funds you've designated.

Life Insurance: Life insurance can be an effective means for a donor to fund a charitable giving plan without significant outlays of cash. Since life insurance generally results in a large payment at one time, this can be an ideal vehicle to involve and initiate family philanthropy with an advised fund or create an endowment for a specific charitable purpose.

Charitable Organization Endowment Funds

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation administers permanent endowment funds for the benefit of more than 320 charitable organizations in central Oklahoma. As of June 30, 2014 – the end of our most recent fiscal year – the fund market value for these endowment funds was \$169 million, representing more than 20 percent of our total assets.

Distribution from most of the endowment funds listed below is based upon a spending policy that calls for distributing 5 percent of a fund’s market value over a 12-quarter period as of March 31. Total annual distribution in 2014 from these endowments funds exceeds \$6.7 million.

Included in the list below on pages 5-10 are eight charitable organizations that have permanent endowment funds that are Affiliated Funds. These organizations are denoted by ■ and were established with a minimum gift of \$500,000 and operate under a specific set of governing documents and structure that is approved by our Board of Trustees. In addition, the Affiliated Funds have a governing body of which the majority are appointed by the Trustees.

Making the Most of a Match Opportunity

For more than 30 years, Jazz in June has brought world class jazz and blues music to central Oklahoma through its free annual music festival in Norman, Okla. In order to enhance its sustainability for the future, the nonprofit organization established a Charitable Organization Endowment Fund in 2007 with assistance from a Kirkpatrick Family Fund Match Grant. Jazz in June agreed to raise \$12,000 within a year from its donors and, in return, Kirkpatrick Family Fund would provide \$8,000 so the organization could establish the endowment at what was then the minimum \$20,000 amount.

For more than 10 years, the Kirkpatrick Family Fund has offered a match of \$1 for every \$3 a nonprofit raises and the match has to benefit the organization's endowment fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. Nonprofit organizations must apply and be approved to participate in a match.

The match program continues a longstanding tradition first started by John and Eleanor Kirkpatrick in the 1970s. On seven different occasions, the Kirkpatricks offered match challenges, encouraging charitable organizations to grow their endowment funds and attract new donors. The mission is the same for the match program now offered through Kirkpatrick Family Fund.

Since its initial match in 2007, Jazz in June has participated in three other matches. To date, the matches have added \$48,500 to the organization's permanent endowment fund that has a balance of nearly \$68,000.

"I can say, unequivocally, the growth and size of our endowment would not have happened without the steadfast support of the Kirkpatrick Family Fund's match program," says Norman Hammon, the organization's development director. "The Kirkpatrick Family Fund has been a partner in almost all of the growth of our endowment."
