95th Division Scholarship	This scholarship encourages graduating high school or college students who are descendants of a soldier who served in any component of the 95th Division to pursue post-secondary education. Applicants must be a descendant of a member of one of the various components of the 95th Division. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA or higher. Financial need preference. May attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Aaron Alley Memorial Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2003 by friends and classmates of Aaron, who died of a brain tumor at age 28. This scholarship is promoted in conjunction with the 1993 class of Woodward High School. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors of Woodward High School and residents of the Woodward community for a minimum of eight semesters before high school graduation. Minimum GPA of 3.50. Financial need considered. Recipients may attend any four-year college in the U.S.
Ainsworth Family Scholarship	This scholarship was established to support graduating high school seniors and current college, university and trade school students from Cherokee Nation or eastern Oklahoma counties. Applicants must be graduates of Oklahoma high schools and have a 3.0 GPA or higher. Preference to Cherokee Nation tribal citizens residing in Cherokee Nation in eastern Oklahoma OR indigenous or underserved graduating high school seniors in eastern Oklahoma.
Alberta Brannon Memorial Scholarship	This scholarship is for current undergraduates studying Hospitality, Tourism, Culinary or a closely-related program with a concentrated course of study involving a Restaurant and Food/Beverage Service major (Baker Assistant; Banquet Caterer; Culinary Arts Assistant; Food Service Attendant, etc.). Applicants must attend an accredited college or technology center in Oklahoma, be a resident of Oklahoma and have a 3.0 GPA or higher. Financial need is considered.
Almeda Kinch Pfleeger Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2014 by an estate gift and legacy fund. Ms. Pfleeger wanted to encourage graduating seniors from Depew High School to pursue post-secondary education degree programs in Oklahoma. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Depew High School with an unweighted GPA between 3.0 and 3.79. Recipients must attend a two-year or 4-year college in Oklahoma. Financial need is considered in the event of a tie. This scholarship is renewable.

Amber Fawn Wooton-Clark Memorial Scholarship Fund	This scholarship was established in 2019 by Woodward High School classmates of Amber Fawn Wooton-Clark. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Woodward High School and be residents of the Woodward community for a minimum of eight semesters before graduation. Must have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher. Financial need will be considered in the event of a tie. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
American Society of Landscape Architects Scholarship	The Oklahoma Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects established this fund to acknowledge good student works in landscape design and landscape architecture. Applicants must be enrolled in a landscape design/architectural degree or certificate program in Oklahoma, including Oklahoma State University, University of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State University-OKC and Langston University. Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and completed 12 credit hours in landscape design/landscape architecture.
Andersen Spraberry Scholarship Perry High School	The Andersen-Spraberry Perry High School Scholarship was established in 2005 by Stella Andersen to honor her parents' leadership in public schools. Applicants must be high school graduating seniors from Perry High School with a GPA of 2.50 or higher. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the United States.
Andersen Spraberry Scholarship Prague High School	The Andersen-Spraberry Prague High School Scholarship was established in 2005 by Stella Andersen to honor her parents' leadership in public schools. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Prague High School with a GPA of 2.50 or higher. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the United States.
April Bowman & Samantha Bowman Fiscus Scholarship for Northwest Classen High School	This scholarship is for Northwest Classen High School fund was established by Sam Bowman in 2018 as a way of giving back to a school that contributed to the education of his daughters, Samantha and April. Bennett Family Scholarship	The Bennett Family Scholarship fund was established in 2015 to encourage graduating seniors from single-parent homes in Oklahoma to pursue post-secondary education degree programs at an accredited college or university offering a four-year curriculum. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and intend to study education, science, technology, engineering and/or mathematics. Financial need is considered.

Benny McReynolds Memorial Scholarship	The scholarship fund was established in 2010 through a bequest from Benny McReynolds. Priority #1: Graduating high school seniors from Frederick High School who plan to attend Western Oklahoma State College. Priority #2: Graduating high school seniors from Frederick High School studying law enforcement at UCO or OCCC. Priority #3: Any student attending OCCC or UCO majoring in law enforcement. Priority #4: Any graduating high school senior from Frederick High School. Financial need is considered.
Betty Ruth Estes Memorial Scholarship Fund	This scholarship was created in 2021 by the Estes Family to honor Betty Ruth Estes. Applicants must be high school graduating seniors from Altus High School in Oklahoma. Applicants must be female and have a 3.0 GPA or higher. Preference to students with demonstrated financial need. Recipients must attend a four-year institution in the United States.
Bobby Lee Loftis Scholarship	The Bobby Lee Loftis Memorial Scholarship Fund was established as an estate gift to benefit Holdenville High School graduates. Recipients must be graduating high school seniors from Holdenville High School in Oklahoma. The scholarship is designated for the top-two students who plan to attend the University of Oklahoma or any four-year university with a better scholarship offer. If no valedictorians attend OU, the selections may open to all Holdenville graduating seniors planning to attend OU.
Brian Wechsler Memorial Scholarship	The scholarship was established by the family in memory of Brian Wechsler. Applicants must be graduating seniors of Edmond Memorial, Edmond North or Edmond Santa Fe high schools in Edmond, Oklahoma. Preference is given to Edmond Memorial students. Applicants must have between a 3.0 and 3.5 GPA and demonstrate participation in extracurricular school activities and community-based activities. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Brunel D. Faris Scholarship Fund	The Brunel Faris Art Exploration Scholarship was established to honor the lifetime achievements of Brunel Faris by encouraging students to achieve excellence in the study of the visual arts. Applicants must be visual arts majors at Oklahoma City University, including studio art & design, film, and game design & animation. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and demonstrate financial need through unfunded academic expenses.
BSO Ivy Foundation Scholarship	The BSO Ivy Foundation Fund was established in 2004 to support the Beta Sigma Omega Chapter charitable scholarships and gifts. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Oklahoma City metro-area high schools. Applicants must have a 2.50 GPA or higher. Preference to female applicants and students attending historically Black colleges.
Capitol Hill High School Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2000 by John E. Orr through a funding challenge to his fellow alumni. The purpose of the award is to enhance post-secondary educational opportunities for Capitol Hill High School graduates. Must be graduating seniors from Capitol Hill High School with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. This scholarship is renewable for up to 4 consecutive years. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in Oklahoma.

Applicants must be either incoming OR current students at the OU College of Medicine. Students must be admitted to the OU College of Medicine before applying for this scholarship. Applicants will be evaluated on their effort and commitment to the study of medicine and their GPA achievement. Preference for students studying epidemiology.
Carolyn Watson Rural Opportunities Scholarship Deadline 2/15/24	This \$12,000, renewable scholarship is awarded to rural Oklahoma students who demonstrate strong leadership skills, the desire to pursue specific educational goals and to attend the college or university that will provide the best opportunity for them to excel.
Carrie Ann Nix Blakey Memorial Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2018 by Carrie's husband and daughters. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Tuttle, Blanchard, Chickasha, Minco, Bridge Creek, Newcastle, Amber-Pocasset, Moore, Westmoore, Southmoore, Yukon or Mustang. Preference to Tuttle High School applicants. Must have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher. Preference to applicants involved in dance or cheerleading activities. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Carrington Hall Scholarship	The Carrington Hall Family Scholarship was established in 2021 to assist Oklahoma high school graduates. Applicants must be graduates of Oklahoma High Schools, including home schools and charter schools. Applicants must demonstrate financial need. Applicants may be incoming freshmen or current undergraduate students. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Charles and Mary Miles Excellence in Education Award	This scholarship was established in 2007 by the family to honor the couple's contribution to the community as educators. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors of high schools participating in the Central Oklahoma High School Counselor Network. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA or higher. Preference to applicants of color who are pursuing studies in English education or education-related fields and have volunteer and service hours. Financial need may be considered.
Charles B. McCauley Scholarship	This scholarship was created to encourage students to pursue a career in public classroom education. Financial need required. Must attend public colleges or universities in Oklahoma. Preference given to sophomores and juniors in college with financial need.
Charles Cash & Jackie Jones Scholarship Fund for Southeast High School Graduates	This scholarship was established by Charles Cash and Jackie Jones, 1963 graduates of Southeast High School, for graduating high school seniors of Southwest High School in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and demonstrate interest in STEM-related disciplines through academic classes and extracurricular activities. Preference to one male and one female recipient each year. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.

Chris Curtis Family Scholarship Fund	This scholarship was established by Chris, Cheryl and Andrew Curtis to benefit students pursuing an undergraduate degree in business. Applicants may apply as graduating high school seniors or current college students. Preference for students who start at a community college and transfer to a four-year university. Preference for graduates of Northwest Classen or Putnam City West High Schools. Recipients may attend any four-year college in the U.S.
Classen '55 Scholars Fund	This scholarship was established in 1997 by the Classen High School Class of 1955 for graduating high school seniors from Classen School of Advanced Studies at Northeast Academy's fine arts program. Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher. Financial need is considered. This scholarship is renewable. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Classen Awards Foundation	The Classen Awards were established in 1926 at Classen High School by Anton H. Classen. The awards have continued through the support and participation of previous award recipients. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors at Classen School of Advanced Studies at Northeast Academy or Northwest Classen High School. Applicants must have a 3.5 GPA or higher. Financial need may be considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the United States.
Classen Class of 1945 Scholarship	The Classen Class of 1945 Scholarship was established in 2006 by the Classen Class of 1945 alumni. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Classen School of Advanced Studies at Northeast with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and demonstrate participation in extracurricular activities. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Classen Class of '54 Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2009 by the Classen High School Class of 1954 to benefit graduating seniors of the school. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Classen School of Advanced Studies at Northeast Academy. Applicants must attend a regional, private, or comprehensive institution in the United States where they will pursue a bachelor's degree. Financial need may be considered in the event of a tie.
Classen High School Alumni Association Scholarship	The Classen High School Alumni Association Scholarship was established in 2012 by the Classen High Alumni Association. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Classen School of Advanced Studies at Northeast Academy's School of Fine Arts with a high school GPA of 2.50 or higher. Financial need is considered. Recipients must attend a public or independent/private, regional or comprehensive, academic institution in Oklahoma.
Cleo and Lucille Craig Scholarship Deadline 2/15/24	The Cleo and Lucille Craig Scholarship Fund was established in the 1980s by the Lawton Kiwanis Foundation to support graduating high school seniors from Lawton Public Schools. Must be graduating high school seniors from Lawton Public Schools, have a GPA of 2.5 or higher, and demonstrate an intellectual or developmental disability (IDD) to be considered. May attend any college or CareerTech in the US.

Commander Family Scholarship	The Commander Family Scholarship was established in 2001 in memory of A.C. (Gus) Commander by his wife Ruth and son Ed. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from high schools in the Central Oklahoma High School Counselor Network. Must demonstrate leadership and participation in school activities and a desire to work. Must have a GPA between 3.0 and 3.79. Must attend college in Oklahoma.
Cravin' Flight Scholarship in Honor of Lt. Col. Matt Kincade	The Cravin' Flight Scholarship Fund was established in 2020 by Lt. Col. Matt Kincade's wife, Gina Kincade, to honor his legacy through aviation scholarships. Applicants must major in a degree program with the intended purpose of training to become a professional pilot. Applicants must be current college sophomores or juniors at a four-year college or university in Oklahoma. A 2.5 GPA or higher is required. Financial aid is considered.
Custom Dental Cares Scholarship Fund	Dr. Kelly and Jan Brown established this scholarship to support dependents of Custom Dental Employees. Applicants must be dependents of employees of any Custom Dental USA location. Preference to students who demonstrate community service and have financial need. Preference for employees who have worked at Custom Dental USA for 2+ years. Dependent is defined as a child of an employee, ages 17-24 years old, who is claimed on the employee or the employee's spouse's tax return or medical insurance.

Dan Zanowiak Memorial Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2007 by his family to honor his contribution to the education and careers of his students. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Edmond Santa Fe High School (at least six semesters in Edmond Public Schools). Applicants must pursue a career or area of study in quantitative analysis, e.g., engineering, computer science, etc. in Oklahoma colleges. Must be U.S. Citizens, have a 3.0 GPA+ and an ACT math sub-score of 24+. Financial need considered.
Darin McBride Memorial Scholarship	The Darin McBride Memorial Scholarship was established as a memorial gift in 2019 by Darin's family and friends. This scholarship will be awarded annually to one graduating Oklahoma high school senior who played little league, junior high or high school football. Applicants for the scholarship must plan to attend the University of Oklahoma. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.20 or higher. Preference for financial need.
Dean Wild Memorial Scholarship	The Dean Wild Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2008 to honor the career of a beloved coach and administrator. Applicants must be high school graduating seniors of Oklahoma high schools where Mr. Wild taught: Putnam City West, Frederick, Hollis and Watonga. Applicants must have a GPA between 3.25 and 3.79. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.

Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Deer Creek High School in Edmond, OK. Deral E. Willis Scholarship	The Deral E. Willis Scholarship Fund was established in 2000 to support awards at the high school where Col. Willis graduated and is awarded in honor of his service to his country. Applicants must be high school graduating seniors from Sentinel High School in Sentinel, Oklahoma. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Do Unto Others Scholarship Fund	This scholarship was established by the Sherrer Family. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Oklahoma high schools in Pushmataha (first preference), Choctaw (second preference), and McCurtain (third preference) counties. Applicants must have a 2.50 GPA or higher. Preference for financial need. Recipients must attend four-year colleges and universities in Oklahoma.

Two awards will go out each year; one for piano and one for vocal music education. Financial need is considered.
Dorothy and Clark Sims Memorial Scholarship	This scholarship was created in 2022 by their daughters, Leslie and Lori, to assist students from Stephens County with their educational goals. Applicants must be current or former residents of Stephens County in Oklahoma and may be high school graduating seniors, undergraduate students, non-traditional students or students pursuing degrees at career technology centers. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Dortha Dever Business Scholarship	The Dortha Dever Business Scholarship supports Oklahoma City University female students committed to professional careers in business. Applicants must be graduates of Oklahoma high schools and U.S. citizens. Must be female, upper-level students pursuing a degree at OCU's Meinders School of Business (apply as sophomores and juniors for awards in the junior and senior years) and have a 2.80 GPA or higher. Preference will be given to finance, accounting, management, or economic majors.

Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Douglass High School with a 2.81 GPA or higher. Financial need is considered. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Dr. Edith King Mental Health Scholarship	This scholarship was established to honor the lifetime commitment and leadership of Dr. King to the field of mental health services in central Oklahoma. Applicants must be Oklahoma residents pursuing a graduate degree that will further a career in mental health service. Preference given to applicants committed to working with juveniles or applicants pursuing degrees or certification at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. Must attend an accredited four-year college in Oklahoma.
Dr. Eugene S. Briggs Memorial Scholarship	The Lions of Oklahoma established this memorial trust fund to honor a fellow Oklahoma Lion, Dr. Eugene S. Briggs. Applicants must be residents of Oklahoma and are graduating, or have graduated, from an Oklahoma high school. Must have financial need. Academic achievement, community service and need will all be reviewed in the application process. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Dr. Michael L. Weber Memorial Scholarship Fund	The Dr. Michael L. Weber Memorial Scholarship Fund was established by his sister, Dr. Maril Weber, in 2021 to assist OU College of Medicine students. Applicants must be accepted to the OU College of Medicine, entering their first year of medical school, demonstrate financial need, and either be residents of the state of Oklahoma or have graduated from an Oklahoma college or university.
Duane and Villa Rae Carter Scholarship	The Duane and Villa Rae Carter Scholarship was established in 2014 to further the higher education of students who deserve financial assistance and show promise of being able to benefit from higher education. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Chickasha High School and must demonstrate financial need. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the U.S.
Durant Community Scholarship	The Durant Community Scholarship Fund was established at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 2004 to honor and encourage students to continue their academic aspirations after high school graduation. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Durant High School. Applicants must have a 3.25 GPA or higher and demonstrate a capacity for leadership by participation in extracurricular activities. Recipients may attend any nonprofit educational institution in the United States.
Durrell Public Law Research Award	The Durrell Public Law Research Award will be awarded to a student enrolled and pursuing a degree from the College of Law at The University of Oklahoma, enrolled and pursuing a degree in a concentration in Constitutional Studies or pursuing a minor in Constitutional Studies at the Institute for the American Constitutional Heritage (IACH) at the University of Oklahoma, or enrolled and pursuing a degree from the School of Law at Oklahoma City University.

Elaine Hahn Memorial Business Scholarship Fund	The Elaine Hahn Memorial Business Scholarship was established in 2019 by Elaine's sister, Kathy Hahn. Applicants must be graduating seniors of high schools participating in the "Central Oklahoma High School Counselor Network." Applicants must be female business students planning to study at a college in Oklahoma. Must have a 3.25 GPA or higher. Preference for first-generation students and financial need.
Elaine Hahn Memorial Business Scholarship Fund for Upperclassmen	The Elaine Hahn Memorial Business Scholarship was established in 2019 by Elaine's sister, Kathy Hahn. The scholarship was created to combine Elaine's passion for both business and higher education. Applicants must be female business majors at Oklahoma colleges with a 3.25 GPA or higher. Applicants must apply during their sophomore year of college. Preference for financial need.
Elizabeth E. Carlson Scholarship	This scholarship was established by Miss Carlson, a retired teacher, to encourage students to follow the career she loved. Applicants may be high school graduating seniors, current college students, or adults planning to pursue higher education at any U.S. college. Applicants must be current students or alumni from the Putnam City School District. Adult learners may be changing careers or maybe current classroom teachers pursuing continuing education to advance their careers in education.
Elizabeth L. Odom Scholarship Fund	This scholarship was created to honor Elizabeth L. Odom. Financial need considered. Recipients must attend public colleges in OK.
Extreme Aquatic Swim Team Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 2018. Applicants must be graduating high school seniors; preference to swimmers who live and attend high school in the Edmond, North Oklahoma City, Deer Creek or Piedmont areas. Homeschooled students are also eligible to apply. Applicants must have an unweighted GPA of 2.75 or greater. Applicants must demonstrate participation with and competition for a high school swim team and/or Oklahoma Swimming registered club team. Financial need considered.

Applicants must be graduating high school seniors from Midwest City High School with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and/or ACT of 22 or higher. Financial need is considered.
