If you've been thinking about starting a Fund or adding to your present one, <u>now is the time to do it</u>.

The end of December also has special significance to us because the 30th will mark the fifth anniversary of our incorporation. It also has <u>special significance to private foundations that</u> may have wished to terminate and transfer their assets to the <u>Community Foundation</u>. Under the complex I.R.S. regulations, any questions as to whether this can be done are removed after we have been in existence for five years.

Since we last reported to you, the Oklahoma Foundation Center Library has acquired micro-film copies of I.R.S. tax returns (990 forms) for all Oklahoma private foundations. Mrs. Robin Lowden, our new assistant to the Executive Director, is also our new Librarian.

We are happy to report that Mr. and Mrs. John Kirkpatrick will be hosts on January 23 for a "black-tie" dinner for Trustees and Donors who have established Funds in the Community Foundation.

As a reminder, <u>a gift of \$1,000 or more is needed to establish a</u> <u>new Fund</u>, either in the Donor's name or the name of someone they may wish to honor. Smaller gifts to be added to existing Funds are, of course, always welcomed and appreciated.

As we approach the end of another very successful year for the Community Foundation we know that our pride and happiness in the progress made is shared by all of the community. <u>This has been</u> <u>a year of encouraging growth</u> in our total assets, which will greatly extend our ability to assist our city's charitable, educational, and cultural institutions.
