MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

At the end of 1977 the COMMUNITY FOUN-DATION had assets of \$7,115,114 derived from contributions made by 578 donors. Charitable organizations received a 30% increase over the preceding year from the grants awarded by the Foundation.

The 160 trust funds operating within the COM-MUNITY FOUNDATION reflect the varied interests of individual contributors. Approximately one-half of the revenue-producing trusts are suggested by the donors for support of specific charities. The remaining trusts are either totally at the discretion of the Foundation trustees or directed toward a particular area of interest. These trusts annually provide a variety of grants which directly influence many community activities.

It has taken about a decade for the COM-MUNITY FOUNDATION to catch hold. In 1977 contributions of \$1,087,969 were received from 214 different donors. The contributions ranged in size from a few dollars to many thousands of dollars, and were a diverse lot of cash, stocks, bonds, realty, mineral interests, and even one Scottish 5-pound note. These gifts are a strong indication of the broad-based public support we are achieving.

1977 has been a satisfying year.

Particularly appreciated is the Roy G. and Alta M. Woods Fund designating various health and cultural programs. Another outstanding addition was the F.M. Knight Trust for Handicapped

Children, established through the terms of her Will. During the year our charter-supporter George H. Shirk passed away, and the Foundation was the recipient of his Bequest benefitting five separate charities.

A sixth bank, Citizens National Bank and Trust Company, was added as a fiscal trustee and we

are proud to have them aboard.

In 1973 a Fund for the construction and maintenance of the Oklahoma Center for Science and Arts was established, following the precedent used for the Dean A. McGee Eye Institute. The Science Center opened its doors to the public on February 13, 1978. Here again is another example of the way the COMMUNITY FOUNDATION has been utilized to make a lasting impact on the quality of life in our city.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The officers and trustees serve as the Distribution Committee and the Governing Body of the Oklahoma City COMMUNITY FOUNDATION. They meet quarterly. Subcommittees on special problems meet more frequently.

The trustees are selected for their integrity, leadership, and understanding of philanthropic needs, and serve without compensation. Each of the nine trustees is appointed for a term of three years, and the terms are staggered so that some appointments and reappointments are made each year.

Six members are representative of public institutions. One each is appointed by the City Council, Chamber of Commerce, United Appeal, Oklahoma City University, University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center and the Fiscal Board. The other three members are appointed by the Trustees' Committee.

THE FISCAL BOARD

Six Oklahoma City banks have adopted a Trust Agreement with the COMMUNITY FOUNDATION and are authorized to receive funds in trust for the Foundation. The investment program of each such trust is handled by that fund's particular trustee bank. The income, and portions of the principal when so authorized, are turned over to the Distribution Committee at the end of the fiscal year for payment to charitable beneficiaries.

Members of the Fiscal Board are Jack Abernathy and the Senior Trust Officer of each of the banks acting as Fiscal Trustees, or some individual selected by the president of the trustee bank.

INDIVIDUAL FUNDS

Donors establish Individual Funds with a contribution of \$1,000 or more, and enjoy maximum tax advantages. These Funds are a permanent part of the Foundation and have their own grantmaking capabilities. Generally, only the income is distributed although disbursements of principal may be requested. The donor may select as beneficiary a specific charitable organization, a general area of interest, or ask the trustees to use their discretion. The money is managed by one of the six trustee banks which the donor chooses.

Individual Funds are named in accordance with the donor's instructions. Listed here are the date the Funds were established, their beneficiaries, and the total amount of principal in the Fund at the end of fiscal 1977.



DISTRIBUTION OF GRANTS


Grants of income totaling \$173,530 were awarded to 52 local charities the last week in January, 1978. This sum is an increase of \$39,480 (30%) over the previous year.

In addition, the trustees authorized distribution of principal to four charities in accordance with requests made by the donors. Beneficiaries were Oklahoma Center for Science and Arts, Inc. for construction costs, Dean A. McGee Eye Institute for glaucoma research, Oklahoma Zoological Society for completion of interior space at new location, Barkouras Foundation for general program support.

The total amount of income and principal distributed by the Foundation to tax-exempt organizations in metropolitan Oklahoma City for 1977 was \$1.132.724.


