Oklahoma City Community Foundation

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation is a nonprofit organization established in 1969 to receive and administer funds for assisting in the advancement of medicine, education, the arts, social services and civic organizations in the Oklahoma City area.

The Foundation does this by encouraging contributions, carefully managing donor gifts and conscientiously distributing funds for charitable purposes which will benefit the citizens of the community. An indication of the Foundation's success is the growing list of citizens and corporations which have made contributions to the Foundation, bringing total assets from \$45,299 in 1969 to nearly \$21 million at the end of 1984.

The Foundation has established several types of funding methods from which donors can choose for management and distribution of their contributions. While detailed information on these various funding methods is available through the offices of the Foundation, generally speaking they fall into two broad categories:

Undesignated Funds—The use of income and principal from these contributions (which can be made in any amount) is left entirely to the judgment of the Board of Trustees, although they respond to the advice of donors in specific instances. This is a preferred method because it provides discretionary income that allows the Trustees to make annual grants in the light of charitable needs of the moment.

Designated Funds—Donors may designate qualified, tax-exempt charitable entities to receive grants from the income or principal of these funds, so long as the Board of Trustees deems the charities appropriate to community needs. Contributions of \$5,000 or more may create a new name fund; contributions of \$500 or more may be made to any existing fund.



The Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees is the Foundation's governing body and also serves as the Distribution Committee. The Committee authorizes and controls all grants made from funds of the Foundation in accordance with the terms governing each fund. The nine members of the Board meet quarterly and serve for three-year staggered terms for a maximum of nine years. Each trustee was chosen for the position because of his or her integrity, leadership and understanding of the philanthropic needs of the Oklahoma City community.

The Fiscal Committee

The Fiscal Committee is independent of the Board of Trustees and is made up of representatives of five community banks, which have been designated as Fiscal Trustees of the Foundation. The Fiscal Committee works to assist in managing the Foundation's investments, but each bank's trust department remains responsible for donor funds placed in its care. The annual earnings of each trust fund are passed on to the Board of Trustees for distribution of grants.

The first annual income distribution of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 1969 totalled \$34,916 on assets of \$823,040. For the fiscal year ending December 31, 1984, the fifteenth in the Foundation's history, income distribution totalled \$1,633,280 on assets of \$20,963,904. This demonstrable growth is testimony to the vision of the founders of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Eleanor and John Kirkpatrick.

In the course of the past fiscal year, the Foundation also distributed \$473,996 in retained earnings for the fiscal years ending January 31, 1982, January 31, 1983, and December 31, 1983. Through its escrowed, or non-trust funds, the Foundation channelled donations for distribution of \$1,910,570. Stipulated principal receipts totalling \$20,000 were also distributed. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation's 1984 distributions to philanthropy totalled \$4,037,846. This is a credit to the stewardship of the Foundation's Trustees.

The Foundation's Trustees share with the Oklahoma City Community a sense of loss in the recent death of Sylvan N. Goldman. A founding Trustee of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Syl Goldman served for ten years, the limit imposed by law. His contribution to the Foundation was in time, interest, and resources. His Name Fund reflects his broad philanthropic interests: medicine, education, the arts, social services, and civic organizations.

In early 1984 C. Don Ellison, former Secretary and General Counsel of the Foundation, resigned for reasons of health. Don Ellison articulated the Foundation's charter and by-laws and for the past fifteen years watched closely over the Trustees to assure that their actions and fiduciary decisions were both prudent and reasonable. Don Ellison provided his professional services to the Foundation as an "in kind" contribution, never asking a fee.

Current Trustees also provide "in kind" contributions. These include the expense for the Annual Distribution Dinner, the Annual Report, and the advice and counsel of SEI in monitoring management of investments. The expert and competent qualifications of each individual Trustee are a value unto themselves. Their worth allows no definition.

To maintain the dimension of these distributions is the primary responsibility of stewardship. The Foundation takes pride in its history and views its future with confidence. The major challenge that lies ahead is the enhancement of the Foundation's endowment assets. To achieve this goal, the Foundation will strive to expand the base of donor support. The composition of this support must come not only from annual contributions, but also from testamentary bequests, like the Crane, Payne, and Shipley Funds. Understanding and acceptance of the Foundation's character and purpose continue to grow community-wide.

On behalf of all the Trustees, sincere appreciation is expressed to the Foundation's staff, which is comprised of one full-time person and two part-time employees. The Foundation also relies greatly on outside support; and, to all who provide this gratuitous assistance, the Foundation also extends its grateful appreciation.

Notes To Financial Statements Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Inc.

December 31, 1984

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Inc. was incorporated December 30, 1968, under the laws of the State of Oklahoma, as a non-profit organization without capital stock for charitable and educational purposes pertaining to the community of greater Oklahoma City.

NOTE A-SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Donations: Certain donations made to the Foundation have been designated for a particular purpose by the donors. It is the expressed intention of the Foundation to honor the designations of donors; however, the Foundation reserves the power to exercise final control over all funds.

Investments: Securities and other investments are maintained by five trustee banks in various trust funds and are carried at the lower of cost or amounts determined by estates at the time of bequest. Costs of donated assets are estimated fair market value at date of gift.

Property and Equipment: Furniture and fixtures are stated on the basis of cost. Depreciation is computed on the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Investments in producing oil and gas properties are amortized based on production and are net of accumulated depletion of \$366,748 for December 31, 1984 and \$269,940 for December 31, 1983.

The Foundation owns 100% of the stock of a corporation which filed a plan of liquidation in 1982. During 1983 the Corporation's plan of liquidation was rescinded. Because the fair market value of the corporation's underlying assets at December 31, 1984 and 1983 were not readily obtainable, it was shown at the Foundation's carrying value. The investment is being accounted for on the equity method. The carrying value is increased by the income earned by the corporation and decreased by the distributions received.

NOTE C-ESCROWED FUNDS

Of the \$961,950 shown as a distribution of escrowed funds in 1984, \$433,000 was contributed in prior years. The remaining \$528,950 was contributed in 1984.

Actual cash distributions of escrowed funds during 1984 totaled \$1,910,570. This figure consists of the following:

NOTE E-INCOME TAXES

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that the Foundation qualifies under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is, therefore, not subject to tax under present income tax laws.
