#### THE YEAR AT A GLANCE:

For the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 1988 the Oklahoma City Community Foundation gave the largest amount in its history — \$1,820,000 — to 200 non-profit organizations in the Oklahoma City area. The graphs on this page show the distribution of these 1988 earnings and the types of funds that generated them.

Total contributions to the permanent endowment of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation were \$3.9 million. This amount included bequests from the estates of Ethel Benedict, O. June Allen, and William and Janet Johnson.

The Johnson Trust augmented the Scholarship Fund from \$700,000 to \$2.1 million.

The Kirkpatrick Center Fund became the third Affiliated Fund of the Community Foundation, with assets of \$4.5 million and its own group of trustees for the administration of that fund.


The 1988 Directory of Oklahoma Foundations, produced by the Community Foundation is now available. The directory gives a profile of all grant making foundations that file with Oklahoma's Attorney General — assets, income, approximate grant size and type of grant typically made by each organization.

The second annual issue of The Sharing Exchange was distributed in September, 1988. The Sharing Exchange explains the missions and needs of 99 of the non-profit agencies that receive funds from the Community Foundation. This publication is intended to be a service to these non-profits as well as to the individuals and organizations that can benefit from their services.

In August, radio station KKNG began broadcasting one-half hour interviews with representatives of the Community Foundation's Designated Fund agencies. The interviews are aired on Sunday mornings.



This report details 281 individual funds that have been named for donors or friends and relatives that the donor wished to honor. The 200 non-profit agencies that receive earnings from these funds are listed with the amounts that have been distributed to them, along with an audited statement. Taken together, the message is clear: The community and the Oklahoma City Community Foundation are made of many parts that depend on one another.

Currently, a minimum contribution of \$5,000 is required to start a Name Fund.







# Grants & Distribution of Earnings Earnings of \$1,820,000 from the Fiscal Year ending on June 30, 1988 were distributed in September, 1988. These earnings were distributed through four programs:

DESIGNATED FUND EARNINGS - Earnings from contributions to the Community Foundation which have been specifically designated to benefit individual agencies. These contributions come from a variety of donors and Name Funds. The distributions were based on a return of 8.0 percent times the average monthly balance in the Designated Fund.

DONOR-ADVISED FUND GRANTS - Grants from the Name Funds indicated. Each year the donors are able to advise the Trustees of the Community Foundation on which organizations should receive grants from their Name Funds.

WILLIAM E. AND MARGARET H. DAVIS FAMILY FUND GRANTS - Grants made by the Trustees of the William E. and Margaret H. Davis Family Fund, an Affiliated Fund established by the children of Mr. and Mrs. William E.

FUND FOR OKLAHOMA CITY - Grants made by the Trustees of the Community Foundation to meet special needs in the community. Contributions to the Fund for Oklahoma City have come from many different donors and Name Funds and provide Oklahoma City with an important source of grant funds.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OKLAHOMA CITY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, INC.

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") was incorporated December 30, 1968 under the laws of the State of Oklahoma, as a nonprofit organization without capital stock for charitable and educational purposes pertaining to the community of greater Oklahoma City.

NOTE A — SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The Foundation prepares its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, certain revenues and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when

the obligation is incurred. The principal differences between this basis and generally accepted accounting principles are due to the methods used to account for donations receivable. accrued interest and dividends, accounts payable and accrued expenses, and distributions payable. The cash basis is used for all instances except for bequests receivable, which are recorded at their present value at the date of bequest, and purchased interest, which is included as an asset until the income is

The accompanying financial statements include the assets, liabilities, fund balance and activities of the Foundation and its two affiliated organizations, The William E. Davis and Margaret H. Davis Family Fund of The Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Inc., and The Ominiplex Affiliated Fund of The Oklahoma Community Foundation, Inc., an affiliated organization formed during the year ended June 30, 1988.

Donations: Certain donations made to the Foundation have been designated for a particular purpose by the donors. It is the expressed intention of the Foundation to honor the designations of donors; however, the Foundation reserves the power to exercise final control over all funds.

It is the intent of the Foundation to distribute all escrowed donations received. Thus, these donations will not become a part of the permanent fund balance.

**Investments:** Securities and other investments are maintained by local trustee banks in various trust funds and are valued at the lower of aggregate cost or market. The cost of donated investments is the fair market value at the date of receipt. **Property and Equipment:** Property and equipment is stated at cost. The cost of donated property and equipment is its fair market value at the date of gift. Depreciation is computed on

the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The estimated useful lives are five years for furniture and fixtures and twenty years for buildings. Producing oil and gas properties are amortized based on production and are net of accumulated depletion of \$389,264 for 1988 and \$529,249

until such time as they become producing.

Reclassification: Certain items in the 1987 financial statements have been reclassified to be comparable to 1988

NOTE  $C = LONG\text{-}TERM\ DEBT$ 

During 1985, the Foundation received a donation of land and a building with a total estimated fair market value of \$225,000. As a requirement of the donation, the Foundation assumed an existing long-term obligation of \$10,500. The long-term

obligation is payable in annual installments of \$1,400 through 1988 and \$2,100 thereafter until the final payment in 1991. In addition, interest payments equal to 9.5% of the outstanding principle balance are due semi-annually.

One of the Community Foundation's objectives is to provide donors with maximum flexibility for achieving their charitable goals while receiving maximum tax benefits.


You may establish a "designated fund" for a specific organization, or you may create a "donor-advised fund," which allows you to advise the Trustees each year on the distribution of earnings from this fund.

If you create a "field of interest fund", its earnings will be allocated each year by the Trustees to charitable organizations within your area of interest. A contribution to the "Fund for Oklahoma City" will be allocated by the Trustees to special grants and projects within the community.

A community foundation is a philanthropic pool where your funds are placed with others, giving even modest charitable contributions the same professional management as multi-million dollar funds. Gifts range in size from \$5 to more than \$1 million. All gifts are acknowledged to the donor and the non-profit beneficiary organization, if one has been designated and the donor has not requested anonymity.

Funds donated to the Community Foundation are managed by the trust departments of four Oklahoma City banks. You may choose which bank will handle your contributions.

Donations may be made in cash, securities, real property, mineral interests, life insurance assignments, or other assets. Contributions can also be made through bequests as well as through a variety of
