## Caring Van Program

Childhood vaccinations are critical in preventing diseases, disability and death but too often children in low-income families don't have the proper access to these lifesaving immunizations. As a result, these children face serious health risks. Thanks to a recent Great Grant from the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, more than 1,100 children in Oklahoma County have received free immunizations through the Oklahoma Caring Foundation and its Caring Van Program.

Health guidelines state that 75 percent of immunizations are required by the age of two but reality is that too many children don't receive these vital vaccinations until they reach school age. And the Oklahoma Department of Health confirms that one in four of our state's children under the age of two is not fully protected against vaccine-preventable diseases.


With Great Grant funding, the Caring Van Program is improving the low rate of immunizations for young children in child care homes throughout Oklahoma County. Child care centers based in homes were targeted because data has shown that these children are more likely to be under immunized. Two Caring Vans, mobile units staffed by registered nurses, traveled to these homes administering free immunizations to children below the age of six.

The Oklahoma Caring Foundation, a non profit organization, was formed by Blue Cross Blue Shield in 1994 to benefit economically disadvantaged Oklahoma children through preventive programs addressing their access to health care. Its Caring Van Program is doing just that and the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is pleased that a Great Grant was able to help more than 1,100 children in Oklahoma County lead healthier lives.
