## Adopt A Park

Oklahoma City is blessed to have numerous public parks and medians that, in the past, have been lush with flowering plants and shrubs, serving as an attribute to a wide variety of neighborhoods and businesses throughout the metropolitan area. A recent budget decision by the city resulted in many of these parks and medians receiving little or no plantings or maintenance.

But thanks to a Great Grant from the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, the non-profit organization Oklahoma City Beautiful is addressing

this problem through its Adopt-A-Park program. The Great Grant provides funding for the Adopt-A-Park coordinator position for three years, allowing Oklahoma City Beautiful to encourage neighborhood groups and citizens to get involved in beautification efforts such as planting and maintaining the flower beds in these city parks and medians.


Working with the Oklahoma City Community Foundation staff, the Oklahoma City Beautiful Adopt-A-Park coordinator rallied volunteers – neighborhood associations, expert gardeners and businesses — to adopt the parks and medians. These volunteers took on the responsibility of planting and maintaining the flower beds. Within a two-week period, 22 public parks and medians had been adopted, the flower beds tilled and planted with cannas thanks to 22,000 canna bulbs donated by Jolene and Butch Snow, owners of Horn's Canna Farm who made the gift upon learning of the need for the Adopt-A-Park program.

The Adopt-A-Park program is now hosting a regular series of free educational seminars to share information on proper maintenance techniques and landscaping issues, creating a much needed network of neighborhood associations and civic groups.
