
## From the Executive Director

## Matching program in effect for scholarship funds

The board of trustees have approved a matching program for all active scholarship funds at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. The match is a dollar fordollar match up to \$10,000 and will run through June 15.

The goal of the match is to raise the endowments of a number of the smaller funds to \$20,000. The Community Foundation will provide significant publicity and assist the scholarship funds' sponsors with materials and ideas to help in their fundraising efforts.

In early March, you will receive a Scholarships Funds brochure in the mail that will include information about the match as well as a list the participating funds. We have contacted all of the funds about their participation in the match program and it is our expectation that up to 50 funds will take part.

Funding for the match is coming from the Winona Presley Fund and the John E. Kirkpatrick Community Fund.
