The Oklahoma City Community Foundation

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation is a non-profit public charity that works with donors and non-profit organizations to develop permanent endowment funds for the benefit of the community. Since its founding in 1969 by a group of Oklahoma City civic leaders, the goal of the Community Foundation is to help meet the changing needs of the community. The Community Foundation staff takes a proactive approach in assisting organizations to identify emerging issues and developing programs that meet those issues.

The activities of the Community Foundation are concentrated in the following three areas:

Managing Endowment Funds for Non-Profits

The Community Foundation manages the permanent endowment funds for more than 250 non-profit organizations. The annual earnings on these funds are used to support the operating expenses of the organizations. In its role as administrator, the Community Foundation helps to develop the funds and provides all of the administrative and investment services.

Managing Charitable Funds for a Wide Range of Purposes

The Community Foundation works with donors and groups to create funds that support a wide variety of community programs such as scholarships. The Community Foundation provides the administrative and investment services and oversees the earnings distribution as directed by the donors.

Providing Leadership in Addressing Community Issues

The Community Foundation trustees have identified several focus areas in which the Community Foundation is working in conjunction with other community groups to develop and fund programs for specific and targeted activities. These areas include the Parks and Public Spaces Initiative, Agency Capacity Building, New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative, and After School Options.

The New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative

The Community Foundation began focusing on scholarship activities in 1997, when the organization's trustees adopted an aggressive strategic plan – known as the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative to encourage students to pursue higher education. The Initiative focuses on not only offering financial incentives to worthy students but it also provides a support system for high school guidance counselors at all Oklahoma County high schools.

During the first five years of the Initiative, the Community Foundation disbursed \$905,000 in scholarship funds to 938 deserving students. To build upon this success, the Community Foundation Board of Trustees has committed \$2.1 million toward the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative through 2007, more than double the amount allocated in the first five years.

The four scholarship programs of Initiative are: The Community Foundation Scholars, the Foundation of Promise Scholars, Oklahoma Youth With Promise Scholars and the Non-Traditional Student Scholars.

Community Foundation Scholars

The Community Foundation Scholar program rewards good students who are also good citizens who might not otherwise qualify for awards based solely on the academic standards. The \$1,000 per student scholarship is a means by which the Community Foundation can encourage recipients to be successful college students. In 2003, the Community Foundation is awarding 86 Community Foundation Scholar awards. Every high school student in Oklahoma County is eligible to participate.

Foundation of Promise Scholars

The Foundation of Promise program provides scholarships for first-generation college students – those who will be the first in their family to attend college. To be eligible for a Foundation of Promise Scholar award, a high school junior must apply and agree to complete specific activities in preparation for college admission. Upon completion of these activities, the student becomes eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship to any accredited post-secondary educational institution. In 2003, 65 students will receive Foundation of Promise Scholar awards.

Youth With Promise Scholars

The Community Foundation works with both public and private agencies to help children who graduated while in foster care receive scholarships. Students receive support from volunteer mentors in addition to funds for college. Last year 26 students received scholarships from this program.

Non-Traditional Scholars

Helping adults re-enter the educational system is the goal of the Non-Traditional Scholars program. Working through six agencies, the Community Foundation identifies students who have completed one educational program and have both the ability and desire to advance to another program. The sponsoring agency identifies the students and agrees to provide mentoring as the student participates in the new educational program.

The Oklahoma County Guidance Counselor Network

An important ingredient in the Community Foundation's New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative is the involvement of the guidance counselors at each of the high schools in Oklahoma County. For many students, the guidance counselor is an important source of information on college admission requirements and financial aid resources. In recognition of the important role they play, the Community Foundation formed the Oklahoma County Guidance Counselor Network. Guidance counselors at all public and independent high schools in Oklahoma County are eligible to participate. For many of these counselors, the information shared at the Network's two workshops per year is an important opportunity to learn about current college admission issues and financial aid opportunities. As an added incentive, the Community Foundation provides at least one Community Foundation Scholars award to each school whose guidance counselor participates.

The Community Foundation would like to take this opportunity to thank the guidance counselors for their participation in the Network. The Community Foundation would also like to acknowledge the principals at each of the high schools for supporting their counselor's participation in this important learning process.

New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative Sponsors

Central High School Alumni Association

The Central High School Alumni Association (CHSAA) continues with a tradition of education for the community by providing scholarships for students who graduate from central Oklahoma high schools. Founded in 1892, Central High School was the first high school in Oklahoma City, providing educational services for Oklahoma City area students until its closure in 1968. According to Robert Ross, class of 1946, the alumni want to continue to honor the tradition of quality education by helping deserving students continue their education after high school.

In addition to the Community Foundation scholars, CHSAA funds at least one vocational technical scholarship and the Leveta Land scholarship for a student in secretarial science. CHSAA is funding five Community Foundation Scholar scholarships to 2003 graduates of Mustang High School.

Irene P. and Samuel E. Frierson Educational Trust

Dr. and Mrs. Frierson were long-term residents of Oklahoma City. They died in the early 1960s. Dr. Frierson was a native of Mississippi and a graduate of Tulane University. He served as an army surgeon in France during World War I and practiced medicine in Oklahoma City for more than 40 years. The Friersons had no surviving children and created the Frierson Educational Trust to provide scholarships for students that attend college in Oklahoma.

The Community Foundation is honored to have the Frierson Educational Trust, currently administered by the Bank of Oklahoma Trust Department, as a sponsor of the Community Foundation Scholars awards.

MidFirst Bank

This Oklahoma City-based financial institution has provided scholarship awards for Community Foundation Scholars, Oklahoma Youth With Promise and A Foundation of Promise.

MidFirst is a corporate sponsor of these scholarship programs with hopes that its example will encourage other Oklahoma corporations and families to provide scholarships for students.

The Community Foundation appreciates the leadership of George Records, Chairman of Midland Group, for his help in establishing the Community Foundation Scholars program and A Foundation of Promise. Winona S. Presley Fund

William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund

The William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund, which was established through bequests, provides opportunities for graduates of Minco High School who show promise of benefiting from higher education.

In addition, the fund also supports nursing education. The second five-year phase of the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative will expand programming to include nursing scholarships that address central Oklahoma's need for more registered nurses. Administered as matching grants, these scholarships are awarded through five Oklahoma City non-profit hospitals. The process encourages the development of employed persons who have demonstrated ability in the field of nursing and who are selected by professional nursing practitioners to pursue a certification or a degree in the field of nursing.

Willie Elizabeth Shipley Fund and the E.K. Gaylord Fund

Through the generosity of these two donors, the Community Foundation Scholarship Endowment is able to provide funding for Community Foundation and Foundation of Promise Scholars. Miss Shipley was the Secretary of the Oklahoma State Senate for many years, and Mr. Gaylord was the founder of the Oklahoman Publishing Company and well-known civic leader.

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation maintains a scholarship program management team with a wealth of hands-on experience dealing with youth, college admissions standards and scholarship administration. That's important especially when donors want to provide the benefits of scholarship funds without the administrative headaches.

Leading the team is Anna-Faye Rose, who joined the Community Foundation to provide social work consultation for case management services provided for survivors of the Murrah Federal Building bombing. She also began direct management of the Community Foundation's scholarship program for children who had a parent die from the blast.

Her experience includes 17 years with the Oklahoma Department of Human Services, primarily in foster care and adoptions. She later served as administrator of the Frances E. Willard Home in Tulsa, a residential childcare facility for adolescent girls. Ms. Rose is a Licensed Social Worker and is a member of the Academy of Certified Social Workers.

Linda Keefe brings a view from inside the high school counseling system. She served 20 years as a secondary public school counselor before joining the Community Foundation's scholarship team. She also has teaching experience, college academic advisory experience and a master's degree in guidance and counseling. In addition, other members of the Community Foundation staff serve in support roles, including providing specialized fund management services, promotion and development and staffing a variety of special events.
