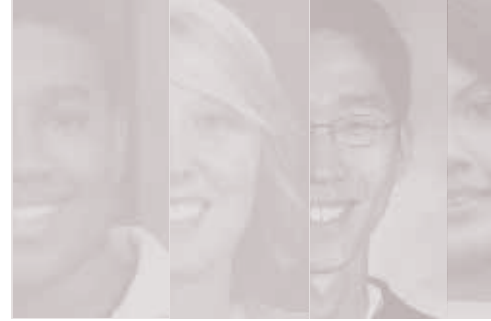

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation was founded in 1969 by philanthropist John E. Kirkpatrick and fellow business leaders in the community. We work with people and organizations to create funds that will benefit their community both now and in the future. Through the generosity of thousands of donors over the past 38 years, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation has grown to be one of the region's most trusted and credible organizations and a leader in identifying emerging issues and developing programs to meet those issues.

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation manages more than 1,000 funds with assets in excess of \$530 million. These funds represent a wide variety of donor interests from education and scholarships to endowments for charitable organizations to the beautification of public lands and parks. In 2006, \$14.4 million flowed back into the community through grants and distributions.

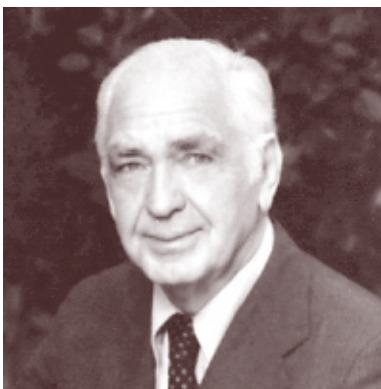

John E. Kirkpatrick 1908-2006

When John E. Kirkpatrick established the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 1969, he was creating a way for others to also support the community through charitable giving. From the beginning he shared his vision and passion for our community in addition to a deep belief in civic responsibility. Thanks to his leadership, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is one of the largest of its kind in the United States. The endowments created to support charitable organizations as well as programs such as scholarships can all trace their origins to Mr. Kirkpatrick's leadership and vision.

When he died on Oct. 3rd, 2006 at the age of 98, Mr. Kirkpatrick left behind not only a substantial financial legacy for charitable causes in our community, but also an even greater personal legacy of generosity and caring.



New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative

In addition to offering scholarship opportunities through five distinct programs, the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative serves as a valuable resource for high school guidance counselors in central Oklahoma. Since 1998, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Board of Trustees has committed more than \$3 million to the five scholarship programs and the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network. Each program and the network are designed to meet very specific needs and opportunities. To date, the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative has awarded more than \$1.5 million in scholarship funds to students in central Oklahoma.

The initiative is comprised of the following programs: The Community Foundation Scholars, the Foundation of Promise Scholars, Oklahoma Youth With Promise Scholars, the Non-Traditional Student Scholars and the Nurse Education Program.

Community Foundation Scholars

The Community Foundation Scholars program rewards good students who are also good citizens. Recipients are students who might not otherwise qualify for awards based solely on academic standards. The \$1,200 per student scholarship is a means by which the Oklahoma City Community Foundation can encourage these students to be successful in their post high school educational endeavors. In 2007, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is providing 97 Community Foundation Scholars awards.

Foundation of Promise Scholars

The Foundation of Promise Scholars program provides scholarships for first-generation college students; those who will be the first in their family to attend college. To be eligible for the award, a first-generation student must apply as a junior and agree to complete specific activities that help prepare them for college admission. Upon successful completion of the activities, the student is eligible for a \$1,200 scholarship to any accredited post-secondary educational institution. In 2007, 77 students representing 28 high schools in central Oklahoma are receiving Foundation of Promise Scholars awards.

Youth With Promise Scholars

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation works with both public and private agencies to award scholarships to students who graduated from high school while in Oklahoma's foster care system. Students also receive support from volunteer mentors in addition to scholarship funds. Most recently, 37 students were awarded scholarships through this program.

Non-Traditional Scholars

The goal of the Non-Traditional Scholar program is to assist adults re-entering the educational system. Working through several agencies, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation identifies adults who have completed one educational program and possess both the ability and desire to advance to another program. The sponsoring agency identifies the students and agrees to provide mentoring as they participate in the new educational program.

Nurse Education Program

In 2003, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Board of Trustees began its efforts to address the qualified staffing challenges facing the metropolitan area's nonprofit hospitals. The program offers scholarships to nurses employed at any of the five participating hospitals who are seeking an RN certification or a bachelor's degree in nursing. Most recently, the program awarded nearly \$30,000 in scholarships to 20 nurses.



The Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network

An important ingredient in the Oklahoma City Community Foundation’s New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative is the involvement of the guidance counselors at each of the 45 high schools in Oklahoma County, Piedmont, Moore, Westmoore, Yukon, Mustang and Norman High School and Norman North High School. For many students, the guidance counselor may be the only source of information on college admission requirements and financial aid resources.

Realizing the important role the counselors serve, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation formed the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network. For many of these counselors the information shared at the Network’s two continuing education workshops per year is the only opportunity they may have to learn about current college admission issues and financial aid opportunities. In addition, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation coordinates campus visits for counselors to universities, colleges and technology centers, both public and private. As an added incentive, we provide at least one Community Foundation Scholars award to each high school with a participating guidance counselor.

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation Scholarship Team

Anna-Faye Rose, scholarship administrator, oversees the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative and has been with the Oklahoma City Community Foundation since 1995. She is assisted by Linda Keefe, a retired high school counselor, and Elizabeth Heard. Both Anna-Faye and Linda provide hands-on experience in dealing with youth, college admissions and scholarship administration. Elizabeth serves as a key contact for both students and parents. In addition, fellow staff members provide fund management services, promotion and development of funds.

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation Scholarship Committee is comprised of a diverse group of key community and business leaders who volunteer their time and expertise to provide valuable insight and guidance to the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative.

New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative: Major Donors

The success of the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative would not be possible without the support of the many donors who have provided funds to be used for scholarships and varied educational programs. Below are highlights of a number of the major donors whose gifts provide substantial support for the Initiative.

Central High School Alumni Association

The Central High School Alumni Association (CHSAA) continues with a tradition of education for the community by providing scholarships for students who graduate from central Oklahoma high schools. Founded in 1892, Central High School was the first high school in Oklahoma City, providing educational services for Oklahoma City area students until its closure in 1968. According to Robert Ross, class of 1946, the alumni want to continue to honor the tradition of quality education by helping deserving students continue their education after high school.

In addition to the Community Foundation scholars, CHSAA funds at least one vocational technical scholarship and the Leveta Land Scholarship for a student in secretarial science. CHSAA is funding seven Community Foundation Scholar awards in 2007.

Irene P. and Samuel E. Frierson Educational Trust

Dr. and Mrs. Frierson were long-term residents of Oklahoma City. They died in the early 1960s. Dr. Frierson was a native of Mississippi and a graduate of Tulane University. He served as an army surgeon in France during World War I and practiced medicine in Oklahoma City for more than 40 years. The Friersons had no surviving children and created the Frierson Educational Trust to provide scholarships for students that attend college in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation is honored to have the Frierson Educational Trust, currently administered by the Bank of Oklahoma Trust Department, as a sponsor of the Community Foundation Scholars awards.

Winona S. Presley Fund

The Winona S. Presley Fund was established in 1999 and supports a variety of educational programs.

Mrs. Presley was a resident of Britton, Oklahoma where she was a longtime supporter of education. In addition to her fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Mrs. Presley established endowments at the Oklahoma 4-H Foundation, the University of Central Oklahoma and Oklahoma City University. Within the New Opportunities

Scholarship Initiative, the Presley Fund supports the activities of the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network, enhancing the knowledge and expertise of Oklahoma County's guidance counselors.

William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund

The William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund, which was established through bequests, provides opportunities for graduates of Minco High School who show promise of benefiting from higher education. In addition, the fund supports the Initiative's Nurse Education Program.

Willie Elizabeth Shipley Fund and the E.K. Gaylord Fund

Through the generosity of donors Willie Elizabeth Shipley and E.K. Gaylord, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is able to provide funding for Community Foundation and Foundation of Promise Scholars.

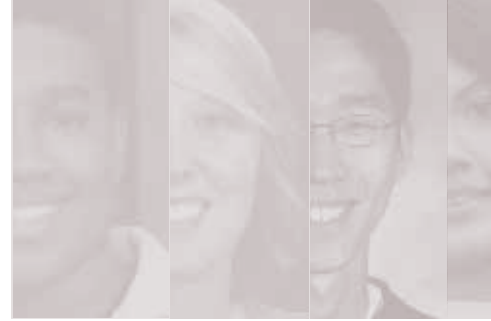
Miss Shipley worked as the Secretary of the Oklahoma State Senate for 48 years and documented some of the most colorful history of a developing state. In 1903, Mr. Gaylord moved from Colorado to Oklahoma Territory and established the Oklahoma Publishing Company which publishes *The Oklahoman*.

Ruth Mershon Trust

Ruth Mershon graduated from the University of Oklahoma Medical School in 1949 and practiced anesthesiology until her retirement in 1996. Through a bequest of the remaining assets of her retirement accounts and other estate gifts, Dr. Mershon established an advised fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. Dr. Mershon's family recommends grants from the fund that support her charitable interests, including funding six awards through the New Opportunities Scholarship Initiative in 2007.

McGee Foundation Fund

The McGee Foundation Fund was generously endowed with a significant gift to support the scholarship programs in 2006. The McGee Foundation was founded in 1963 by Dean A. McGee and his wife Dorothea. The McGees were involved in a wide range of business and civic endeavors and Mr. McGee was one of the nine original Trustees of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation in 1969. The McGee Foundation, which is now managed by the McGee daughters, has supported our scholarship opportunities for first generation students and foster children for a number of years.

Quin Tran has more than 15 years of media experience. Her television news career includes more than 10 years at KFOR-TV (Channel 4) as an anchor and reporter. During that time, she was part of the award winning news team that covered the Oklahoma City bombing and the May 3rd tornadoes. Early in her career she worked in Waco, Texas and covered numerous stories involving the Branch Davidian standoff. In 2005, she was honored by the local chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists in the category of Best Reporting Portfolio.

Quin has also earned national recognition from the Asian American Journalists Association. The organization gave her first place honors in the category of reporting. While in college at the University of Central Oklahoma (UCO) in Edmond, Okla., the Radio Television News Directors Foundation awarded her one of its top national honors and scholarships. At the age of 23, QUIN earned her first Emmy Nomination for a piece called "American Dreams." The report documents her family's journey from Vietnam to the United States.

Quin is an advocate of community service. She is a past board member of the Edmond Women's Club and the UCO Alumni Association. She is a member of the American Women in Radio and Television, a board member of Oklahoma Media Network, Public Relations Society of America and St. Mary's Parent Organization.

Quin recently left television news to be a better mother to her young daughter. She has started her own consulting business helping clients with video projects, media relations and public relations. She will also be an adjunct instructor this fall at UCO, where she is a proud alumna of the Mass Communications program. Quin has a bachelor's degree in Communications with an emphasis in Broadcast News and a minor in Political Science.

Guest Speaker Bio

Linda Cavanaugh began her career as a reporter/photographer and in a short time, became the first female co-anchor of the evening newscast at Oklahoma's NewsChannel 4. She now anchors the 4:30 p.m., 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. broadcasts.

Linda has earned more than 30 national awards for her reporting as well as twice that many state and regional awards in addition to 11 Emmys from the Heartland Chapter of the National Television Academy. In 1998, Linda was inducted into the Oklahoma Journalism Hall of Fame and was noted as "one of the most distinguished journalists in the state's history."

An Oklahoma native, Linda has worked throughout her career to better her community and the state she calls home. Through her efforts, the first hospice in Oklahoma was created. Her documentary, "A Time To Die," raised the seed money that was used to start Hospice of Oklahoma County, a non-profit organization that brought home care to the terminally ill.

Her investigative reports on conditions inside Oklahoma restaurants resulted in changes in the law. "Behind Kitchen Doors" moved lawmakers to open the inspection records of the health department so that consumers, for the first time, could be aware of violations. In the early 1990s, Linda became the first journalist to photograph ancient Indian rituals that had been closed to all except tribal members. Her resulting 12-part series, "Strangers In Their Own Land," brought a sense of understanding and pride to Oklahoma's 37 Indian tribes.

Linda lives in Oklahoma City with her husband and their two children.
