So it was fitting that following Curt's death in a 1985 commercial airline crash at the age of 46, his friends and family created an endowment at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation to benefit the Lyric Theatre Academy, now known as the Thelma Gaylord Academy. Each year, the academy fuels the passion of more than 300 young performers ages 5-18 through classes in acting, music and dance. An annual distribution from the Curt Schwartz Lyric Theatre Scholarship Fund helps to ensure children who would not otherwise be able to attend can do so, thus encouraging their interest in live theatre.
