Requirements for all scholarships awarded:

- 1. Must be utilized within one year of high school graduation.
- 2. Applicable to full-time enrollment only.
- 3. Disbursed only to academically accredited not for profit institutions in the United States for payment of student tuition, academic fees and textbooks.

Community Foundation Scholars

In 1997, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Trustees developed the Community Foundation Scholar Award program to raise the expectations and commitment of central Oklahoma high school students to pursue educational opportunities beyond high school. Now in its 14th year, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation has awarded 1,175 scholarships to worthy seniors.

Participating high schools will accept applications for the 2011 program in November of 2010.

If you meet the following criteria then you should apply for this \$1,500 scholarship.

- Spring semester 2011 graduate of a high school participating in the Central Oklahoma Guidance Network.
- Ability to benefit from additional education as demonstrated by a GPA between 3.25 and 3.79.
- Demonstrated commitment to education as reflected in the written scholarship application.
- Demonstrated commitment in school or community activities outside the classroom as reflected in the written scholarship application.
- Do not qualify for other academic or performance-based scholarship/tuition awards.

Foundation of Promise Scholars *for First Generation Scholars*

Foundation of Promise scholarships began in 2000. Students apply for this scholarship program in their junior year of high school.

If accepted to the program, the student and their parent sign a "Letter of Understanding" agreeing to complete a series of guidance activities by February 15 of their senior year. Students successfully completing the required activities receive a scholarship.

In the past nine years, 676 students completed their required activities and were awarded scholarships.

If you meet the following criteria then you should apply for this \$1,500 scholarship.

- A student in the junior class of a high school participating in the Central Oklahoma Guidance Network.
- The first generation of your family to attend college: Please talk with your school's participating Guidance Counselor for specific information on definition of "first generation."
