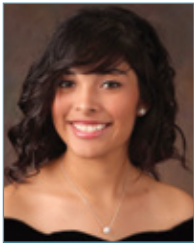

Since 1998, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Board of Trustees has committed more than \$6 million to the Trustee Scholarship Initiative's five scholarship programs and the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network. Each program and the network are designed to meet very specific needs and opportunities. To date, the Trustee Scholarship Initiative has awarded more than \$3 million in scholarship funds to 1,853 students in central Oklahoma. Below are summaries of the initiative's five programs:

Community Foundation Scholars

The Community Foundation Scholars program rewards good students who are also good citizens. Recipients are students who might not otherwise qualify for awards based solely on academic standards. In 2010, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is providing each of the 83 Community Foundation Scholars with a \$1,500 award.

Foundation of Promise Scholars

The Foundation of Promise Scholars program provides scholarships for first-generation students who will be the first in their family to attend college. To be eligible for the award, a first-generation student must apply as a junior and agree to complete specific activities that prepare them for college admission. Upon successful completion of the activities, the student is eligible for a \$1,500 scholarship to any accredited post-secondary educational institution. In 2010, 61 students are receiving Foundation of Promise Scholars awards.

Youth With Promise Scholars

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation works with both public and private agencies to award scholarships to students who graduated from high school while in Oklahoma's foster care system. In addition to scholarship assistance, these students also receive support from volunteer mentors. Most recently, 56 students were awarded scholarships through this program.

Non-Traditional Scholars

The Non-Traditional Scholar program assists adults re-entering the educational system. Working through several agencies, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation identifies adults who have completed one educational program and possess both the ability and desire to advance to another program. The sponsoring agency identifies the students and agrees to provide mentoring as they participate in the new educational program.

Nurse Education Program

In 2003, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Board of Trustees began its efforts to address the qualified staffing challenges facing the metropolitan area's nonprofit hospitals. The program offers scholarships to nurses employed at any of the five participating hospitals who are seeking an RN certification or a bachelor's degree in nursing.

Our Staff

Anna-Faye Rose is the scholarship administrator for the Trustee Scholarship Initiative and has been with the Oklahoma City Community Foundation since 1995. She is assisted by Linda Keefe, a retired high school guidance counselor, who also oversees the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network. Our scholarship coordinator Jane Rauh works with several of the initiative programs including Oklahoma Youth With Promise.

The Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network

An important ingredient in the Oklahoma City Community Foundation's Trustee Scholarship Initiative is the involvement of the guidance counselors at the 51 high schools in Oklahoma County communities, Piedmont, Moore, Yukon, Mustang, Norman, El Reno and Guthrie.

Realizing the important role these counselors fill, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation provides important resources through its Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network. For many of these counselors, the information offered through two annual continuing education workshops provides the only opportunity to learn about current college admission issues and financial aid opportunities. In addition, we coordinate campus visits for counselors to universities, colleges and technology centers in Oklahoma and surrounding states. As an added incentive, each year we provide at least one Community Foundation Scholar award to each of the high schools whose guidance counselor participated in the activities.

Albers Family Affiliated Fund

Both graduates of John Marshall High School, Paul and Leigh Ann Albers returned to live in Oklahoma City in 2007. After graduating from West Point and serving in the U.S. Army, Paul worked overseas for the federal government. In 1991, he and two former colleagues founded an advanced technology security company that grew to have six offices worldwide and 500 employees within 14 years. The Albers lived in Virginia Beach, Va., until selling the business in 2006. The couple established the Albers Family Affiliated Fund in 2006 to support organizations and causes important to their family. In 2010, the Albers Family Affiliated Fund supported four Community Foundation Scholar awards at John Marshall High School.

Central High School Alumni Association

The Central High School Alumni Association (CHSAA) continues with a tradition of education for the community by providing scholarships for students who graduate from central Oklahoma high schools. Founded in 1892, Central High School was the first high school in Oklahoma City, providing educational services for Oklahoma City area students until its closure in 1968. In addition to supporting six Community Foundation Scholar awards in 2010, CHSAA funds at least one vocational technical scholarship and the Leveta Land Scholarship for a student in secretarial science.

Irene P. and Samuel E. Frierson Educational Trust

Dr. and Mrs. Frierson were long-term residents of Oklahoma City. Dr. Frierson was a native of Mississippi and a graduate of Tulane University and served as an army surgeon in France during World War I. He returned to practice medicine in Oklahoma City for more than 40 years. The Friersons, who both died in the early 1960s, had no surviving children and had created the Frierson Educational Trust to provide scholarships for students that attend college in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation is honored to administer the Frierson Educational Trust in conjunction with the Bank of Oklahoma Trust Department. The Frierson Educational Trust supports the Community Foundation Scholars program.

E.K. Gaylord Fund

In 1903, E.K. Gaylord moved from Colorado to Oklahoma Territory and with two partners established the Oklahoma Publishing Company, which publishes *The Oklahoman*. Mr. Gaylord established the scholarship fund prior to his death and a bequest from his estate also benefitted the fund. The E.K. Gaylord Fund supports awards made through the Community Foundation Scholars and Oklahoma Youth With Promise programs.

William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund

The William M. and Janet S. Johnson Scholarship Fund, established through bequests from the Johnsons' estate, provides opportunities for graduates of Minco High School who show promise of benefiting from higher education. In addition, the fund also supports the Initiative's Nurse Education Program.

Ruth Mershon Trust

Ruth Mershon graduated from the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in 1949 and practiced anesthesiology until her retirement in 1996. Through a bequest of the remaining assets of her retirement accounts and other estate gifts, Dr. Mershon established a fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation through which her family recommends grants that support Dr. Mershon's charitable interests including funding six awards through the Trustee Scholarship Initiative in 2010.

McGee Foundation Fund

The McGee Foundation Fund was generously endowed with a significant gift to support the Trustee Scholarship Initiative programs in 2006. The McGee Foundation was founded in 1963 by Dean A. McGee and his wife, Dorothea. The McGees were involved in a wide range of business and civic endeavors, and Mr. McGee was one of the nine original Trustees of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. The McGee Foundation, which is now managed by the McGee daughters, has supported scholarship opportunities for first generation students and foster children for a number of years.

Winona S. Presley Fund

The Winona S. Presley Fund was established in 1999 through a bequest in Mrs. Presley's estate and supports a variety of educational programs. A former teacher, Mrs. Presley was a longtime supporter of education. In addition to her fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, Mrs. Presley established endowments at the Oklahoma 4-H Foundation, the University of Central Oklahoma and Oklahoma City University. Within the Trustee Scholarship Initiative, the Winona S. Presley Fund supports the activities of the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network.

Willie Elizabeth Shipley Fund

Through the generosity of donors like Willie Elizabeth Shipley, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation is able to provide funding for Community Foundation Scholars and Foundation of Promise Scholars. Miss Shipley worked as the secretary of the Oklahoma State Senate for 48 years and documented some of the most colorful history of a developing state. A bequest from her estate was left to Oklahoma City Community Foundation to benefit students.

Are you interested in establishing a scholarship fund?

The Trustee Scholarship Initiative programs are supported by funds established by donors (see pages 4-5 for a list of current donors). If you are interested in supporting the Trustee Scholarship Initiative through a fund, please read below. A donor may establish a fund of \$10,000 or more that provides financial support for a scholarship awarded through one of the Trustee Initiative Scholarship programs (please see page 2 for a description of the five programs).

Through that fund, you may choose one of the following ways to direct the support:

- support a particular scholarship program or
- support an award made at a specific high school of the Central Oklahoma Guidance Network.

Additional Endowed Scholarship Fund Opportunities

In addition to the Trustee Scholarship Initiative program, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation also administers more than 100 fully endowed scholarship funds. If you are considering establishing a fully endowed scholarship fund that is uniquely named, we recommend you first review the Scholarship Directory at www.occf.org to see if you can accomplish your charitable goals through an existing endowed fund. The minimum for a fully endowed and uniquely named scholarship fund is \$40,000 and can be accumulated over time and come from more than one donor.

4 key questions to consider before you establish a fully endowed scholarship fund:

1. What is the purpose of the scholarship fund?

Examples:

- Encourage students
- Promote a professional field
- Memorialize or honor a loved one

2. What criteria will be used in selecting the recipient?

Examples:

- Academic merit
- Financial need
- Community service
- Contest or award winner

3. What value will the award have and is it a one-time award or an award a student can re-apply for in subsequent years?

- Please note the minimum award amount is \$1,000

4. What role or roles will you have?

Examples:

- Donor only
- Selection Committee member
- Participate in public presentation of award to recipient

IRS Requirements

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation must ensure that the scholarship criteria and administrative processes for all scholarship funds are in compliance with regulations of the Internal Revenue Service regarding charitable funds. As a result, our Trustees:

- must assure that the promotion and selection process is fair, equitable and non-discriminatory.
- must have final approval regarding all scholarship recipient selections.
- must assure expenditure control over all disbursements (all disbursements are transmitted to the scholarship recipient's educational institution).
