Helping Visually-impaired Seniors Live Independently

In Oklahoma, more than 650,000 adults age 55 and older live with vision impairment or eye disease that significantly impacts their quality of life and can limit their ability to live independently. Thanks to a Services for Elderly iFund grant, NewView Oklahoma is providing orientation and mobility training to this population that will help them navigate around their home safely and with confidence.

Established in 1949 as the Oklahoma League for the Blind, NewView Oklahoma provides visual rehabilitation services and employment opportunities for blind and visually-impaired Oklahomans. Through its Older Blind Adult Vision Rehabilitation Program, clients receive hands-on mobility training in their own home at little to no cost. A certified orientation and mobility instructor first evaluates the safety of the client's home to reduce potential risks such as uneven walkways that might cause falls or injury. The instructor then provides in-home safe travel training over a seven-week period to help individuals perform common daily tasks such as getting the mail or taking out the trash.

"As the population ages, these services are vital to helping older Oklahomans remain independent and living at home," says Lauren Branch, NewView Oklahoma president and CEO. "The iFund grant will enable us to add an exercise component to our orientation and mobility training that is designed to improve coordination, balance and flexibility."

NewView's orientation and mobility instructors will train clients to safely perform basic exercises including arm and leg raises to help improve their sense of balance and train their muscles for movements such as climbing stairs and turning corners. Lauren says their goal is to develop an exercise program tailored to the client's specific needs, allowing them to engage in physical exercise on a daily basis.

"The exercise program has been very warmly received," says NewView mobility instructor Okono Okono. "The clients love it. They look forward to the exercises and many say they can already see improvements in their balance and stability."
