Requirements for all scholarships awarded:

- 1. Must be used within one year of high school graduation.
- 2. Applicable to full-time enrollment only.
- 3. Disbursed only to academically accredited nonprofit institutions in the United States for payment of student tuition, academic fees and textbooks.

Community Foundation Scholars Good Students, Good Citizens

In 1998, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Trustees established the Community Foundation Scholars program to encourage high school students in central Oklahoma to pursue post-secondary education. Community Foundation Scholars are students who might not otherwise qualify for awards based solely on academic standards, but have illustrated that they are good students and good citizens. To date, the Community Foundation Scholars program has awarded more than \$1.5 million in scholarship funds to 1,342 worthy students.

Participating high schools will accept applications for the 2013 program in November of 2012.


Students who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply for this \$1,500 scholarship:

- Spring semester 2013 graduate of a high school participating in the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network.*
- Ability to benefit from additional education as demonstrated by a GPA between 3.25 and 3.79 on a 4.0 scale.
- Demonstrated commitment to education as reflected in the written scholarship application.
- Demonstrated commitment in school or community activities outside the classroom as reflected in the written scholarship application.
- Does not qualify for other academic or performance-based scholarship/tuition awards.

New Opportunities Scholars for First Generation Scholars

Established in 2000 as the Foundation of Promise Scholars, the New Opportunities Scholars program awards scholarships to students who will be the first generation of their family to attend college. Students must apply in their junior year of high school.

If accepted to the program, the student and their parent sign a "Letter of Understanding," agreeing to complete a series of guidance activities by February 15 of their senior year. Students successfully completing the required activities will receive the scholarship.

Since its inception, the program has awarded more than \$975,000 in scholarship funds to 789 students who successfully completed their required activities.

Students who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply for this \$1,500 scholarship:

- A student in the junior class of a high school participating in the Central Oklahoma Guidance Counselor Network.*
- The first generation of your family to attend college. Please ask your school's participating guidance counselor for specific information on the definition of "first generation."
