GiveSmartOKC: Helping the Community Give Back

Now in its third year, GiveSmartOKC.org is becoming an essential tool for the central Oklahoma charitable sector. Featuring a searchable directory with detailed information on more than 240 charitable organizations, Give Smart OKC provides valuable knowledge to help the community make more informed charitable giving decisions.

Each charitable organization featured on GiveSmartOKC has voluntarily met the top standard in transparency by answering questions and providing data about programs, management, governance and financials. There is no charge for nonprofits to join and the website is free for the public to use.

As the only area resource of its kind, Give Smart OKC is the go-to information source for anyone looking to learn more about central Oklahoma nonprofits, including funding organizations. Since 2013, the Kirkpatrick Family Fund has utilized GiveSmartOKC in its grant program by offering a shorter application for nonprofits with a current GiveSmartOKC profile.

"Nothing compares to what Give Smart OKC offers," says Tina Burdett, Kirkpatrick Family Fund grants and programs administrator. "GiveSmartOKC equalizes the playing field. We are able to see similar information across a wide field of nonprofits."

Other funders using GiveSmartOKC include Bank of Oklahoma and Devon Energy. Bank of Oklahoma recently launched a new employee recognition program, "Together We Give," that allows employees to nominate coworkers for the opportunity to award a \$100 grant to a charitable organization featured on GiveSmartOKC. Since April, Bank of Oklahoma employees have selected 11 nonprofit organizations to each receive a \$100 grant.

"We're looking for trusted nonprofits to reward and GiveSmartOKC provides that," says Vonnie Garner, Bank of Oklahoma's assistant vice president of Oklahoma City community relations.

Our Spending Policy: Striking the Right Balance

Of primary importance to any permanent endowment program is a prudent approach to how the annual distribution amount is calculated. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation's approach is to have a spending policy in place that provides a structured method of making annual distributions from an endowment fund. The spending policy protects the distribution amount from inflation, provides a predictable annual distribution and allows our Investment Committee and investment managers to focus on maximizing total investment return.

Since 1989, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation has employed a spending policy that is designed to permit funds to capitalize on good investment years as well as protect in the event of a low or negative return market. The economic volatility we experienced several years ago, where returns were on both extremes of investment performance, supports the wisdom of a spending policy that stabilizes the effects of market conditions on annual distribution from an endowment.

Annual distributions from the majority of permanent endowment funds administered by the Oklahoma City Community Foundation are based on a spending policy that distributes 5 percent of the fund's average market value for the previous 12 guarters as of March 31. The remaining investment return remains in the fund to add to the value, thus building the fund value and protecting the future distribution stream from inflation. The annual distribution from the fund is more predictable because the amount is not tied to current income that fluctuates due to shifts in market conditions. Instead, the annual distribution is based on a rolling quarter average of the fund's market value. Initially, the number of quarters used was eight but was changed to 12 quarters in 2011 to further stabilize the flow from stock market fluctuations.

We are pleased to report that the investment performance total return for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 is 14.56 percent. Please see page 5 for details of the overall investment performance.

"Large educational and institutional endowment managers across the country regard the 5 percent spending policy as a standard and a safe amount to distribute while still protecting the principal," says Nancy B. Anthony, president, Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

The 5 percent figure is based upon an estimate of two factors: market return and inflation. A conservative prediction of average market return over time is 8 percent while it is expected that inflation would average 3 percent over time. This leaves 5 percent to spend while still protecting the fund's value for the future.

While there are other approaches to determining distributions, the 5 percent spending rule does not require a specific investment allocation to income producing assets and is not subject to shortterm market fluctuations. The spending policy also allows our investment managers to focus on achieving the best total return.

"The total return concept is especially important because of our goal of growing endowment funds," Anthony says. "There is an available annual distribution of 5 percent from an endowment fund that is increasing in value over time even if there are no additional donor contributions to the fund."



Charitable Organization Endowment Funds

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation administers permanent endowment funds for the benefit of more than 320 charitable organizations in central Oklahoma. As of June 30, 2014 – the end of our most recent fiscal year – the fund market value for these endowment funds was \$169 million, representing more than 20 percent of our total assets.

Distribution from most of the endowment funds listed below is based upon a spending policy that calls for distributing 5 percent of a fund's market value over a 12-quarter period as of March 31, 2014. Total annual distribution in 2014 from these endowments funds exceeds \$6.7 million.

Included in the list below are eight charitable organizations that have permanent endowment funds that are Affiliated Funds. These organizations are denoted by . These funds were established with a minimum gift of \$500,000 and operate under a specific set of governing documents and structure that is approved by our Board of Trustees. In addition, the Affiliated Funds have a governing body of which the majority are appointed by the Trustees.

Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition

For 25 years, the Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition (OVAC) has been promoting visual arts in the community and supporting artists through funding, education and exposure. The nonprofit organization serves artists working in the state through various grant programs, educational workshops and art exhibitions. In addition, it helps to foster public interest in the arts and connect audiences to visual artists.

Thanks to OVAC's innovative programs such as Art 365, artists in Oklahoma have access to opportunities not commonly found in other states. Every three years, five artists are selected to participate in Art 365, which provides the artists with \$12,000 each and one year to work with a guest curator to create an original body of artwork. The project culminates with a five-month exhibition in both Oklahoma City and Tulsa.

OVAC interim director Kelsey Karper says the program is an opportunity for artists to move to the next phase in their career. She says that the yearlong relationship with the curator combined with the financial support is often transforming for the artists.

In 1998, OVAC established a charitable organization endowment at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, from which it receives an annual distribution to help support programs such as Art 365. To learn more about OVAC, visit their nonprofit profile at GiveSmartOKC.org.

Giving now: Your Options

By giving now to a charitable endowment fund, you can experience the impact of your gift.

Cash Gifts: Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation can be in the form of cash, check, money order or a cashier's check. You can mail a cash contribution to: Oklahoma City Community Foundation, P.O. Box 1146, Oklahoma City, OK 73101-1146.

You may also make a gift with a major credit card via our secure online giving system at www.occf.org/onlinegiving.

Real Estate: Real estate may be given at appraised value. If appreciated, capital gain taxes may be avoided on the real estate appreciation if the property is contributed to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. Gifting real estate may allow you to preserve liquid assets while maximizing your charitable contributions.

Business-related Assets: We accept gifts of individuallyowned business assets such as closely-held C-corp. and S-corp. stock, partnerships and LLCs.

Stocks and Bonds: If appreciated, marketable or closely-held securities, such as stocks and bonds, offer you the ability to realize significant tax savings while maximizing your charitable contributions by providing income tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding the capital gains tax on those donated assets. We have accounts at many brokerage firms and can facilitate the transfer of donors' securities.

Oil and Gas Interests & Royalty Interests: Both oil & gas working interests and royalty interests may be donated to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. The contribution of oil and gas interests may allow the donor to preserve liquid assets while maximizing charitable contributions.

Giving later: Your Options

By making a planned gift through your estate, you defer your giving.

Charitable Gift Annuities: A charitable gift annuity (CGA) provides the donor not only with income for life but also the peace of mind of making a difference through a lasting gift to the community. Through a CGA, a donor makes a gift with cash or other assets, receives income for life and, at the end of the annuity, the remaining assets will go to the charitable funds of the donor's choosing.

Bequests: With a bequest, a donor can designate a percentage, the residual or their entire estate to benefit an existing charitable fund. A bequest may provide a donor's family with substantial reductions in federal estate taxes.

Retirement Plan Assets: Retirement plan assets are subject not only to estate taxes, but also income taxes. To reduce this burden on heirs and to create a charitable legacy, donors can use retirement plan assets to maximize their charitable contributions by establishing an advised fund. The donor's heirs can make suggestions as to which charitable organizations or causes to support with the earnings from the fund.

Charitable Remainder Trusts: A charitable remainder trust allows a donor to place assets in a trust that pays annual income to the donor or a beneficiary for life or a term of years. Upon the trust's termination, the remaining assets will benefit funds designated by the donor.

Life Insurance: Life insurance can be an effective means for a donor to fund a charitable giving plan without significant outlays of cash. Since life insurance generally results in a large payment at one time, this can be an ideal vehicle to involve and initiate family philanthropy with an advised fund or create an endowment for a specific charitable purpose.

Charitable Gift Annuity: Planning for the Future While Giving Back

Following a life of public service, former Congressman Wes Watkins and his wife Lou are enjoying their retirement in Stillwater, Okla., the town where they first met more than 50 years ago while attending Oklahoma State University. Planning for the future, the Watkins were looking to downsize their estate and sell land that had significantly increased in value over the years. The couple recently worked with the Oklahoma City Community Foundation to create a deferred charitable gift annuity with the real estate that will benefit several causes important to them while also supplementing their retirement income and creating a tax savings.

The Watkins' charitable gift annuity will yield an additional income stream for life, then the remaining assets will support scholarships through both the FFA and OSU foundations, as well as benefit the Lou Watkins Endowed Lectureship at East Central University in Ada, Okla., and the Fairlawn Cemetery in Stillwater.

"This was a great way to help several groups that we feel strongly about, while also allowing us to offset potential taxes associated with selling the land," Mr. Watkins says.
