Understanding Endowments

Endowments are permanent funds established to serve as a source of perpetual income for a charitable purpose such as a nonprofit organization or a scholarship fund. At the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, our investment and spending policies are structured with the knowledge that the endowment funds need to provide income for years to come. The Oklahoma City Community Foundation administers more than 1,300 permanent endowment funds including nearly 350 charitable organization endowment funds (see list beginning on page 5) and more than 170 scholarship and award endowment funds (see list beginning on page 11).

Who Establishes Endowments for Organizations and Scholarship Purposes

Permanent endowment funds for the benefit of a nonprofit organization can be established by the organization itself or individual donors. Scholarship and award endowment funds provide a unique way to support the educational aspirations of others, honor a loved one or encourage a career path. The minimum amount required to establish an endowment for a charitable organization or for scholarship purposes is \$40,000.

In addition to providing prudent investment and spending policies, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation also offers the following services to the organization and scholarship endowment funds:

Fund Management and Administration – We provide gift processing and gift acknowledgements and provide each organization and scholarship representative with a customized annual report of their fund(s) including individual gifts, distributions or scholarships and investment performance information. Thanks to our secure online giving service, we are also able to facilitate contributions made with credit cards for the benefit of both charitable organization and scholarship endowment funds. In addition, we offer expertise for accepting unique gifts such as real estate or closely-held stock.

Development, Communications and Training – All of the endowment funds are promoted through publications and on our website, occf.org. For organizations, Central Oklahoma Charities serves as an online directory that offers contact information and email and website links. The Scholarship Directory provides an opportunity for donors to give to a specific scholarship fund. AcademicWorks is the primary resource outlining scholarship criteria and the application process for the more than 100 scholarship award programs.

DonorCentral – Organizations and scholarship representatives have around the clock access to a secure online reporting system that provides information on endowment fund balances, gifts, annual distribution and award history and quarterly investment performance results.

Planned Giving Services – Our staff works with organizations, scholarship fund representatives and donors to help facilitate a variety of planned gifts for the benefit of an endowment fund.

GiveSmartOKC.org – The website is a partnership with GuideStar and serves as a powerful online resource that encourages informed giving in central Oklahoma. The majority of organizations with charitable organization endowment funds have voluntarily created profiles on the website. The website provides details about finances, governance, management and programming.



Online Scholarship Application Process – In 2013, we launched an online scholarship application process that has streamlined the application process for the students as well as eased the review process for the individuals who review the applications. The online application process increases access to all of our scholarship programs to a wide range of students.

Our Investment Management and Policy

Since our founding in 1969, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation has been central Oklahoma's leading advocate for building endowment funds through not only support from donors but also through sound investment and distribution strategies.

Low Administrative Expenses & Investment Costs

Our investment policy benefits all endowments, large and small, because we balance the use of active managers and index funds in a way that maximizes the opportunity for adding value while keeping the cost low. We attempt to balance the level of services provided with a cost conscious approach.

The low cost and efficient operation of our investment management program benefits all endowment funds. For Fiscal Year 2015, our cost of investments was 30 basis points (30/100 of 1 percent) compared to more than 100 basis points charged for the average mutual fund or active equity fund manager that requires a large minimum account.

Investment Policy & Investment Committee's Role

Our investment policy is specifically designed for an endowment fund to provide annual distributions for charitable purposes in perpetuity. Our policy's goals are to allow the fund to generate distributions, grow to accommodate inflation and continue to exist in the future.

Our Investment Committee uses a style-based investor management system and allocates assets to specific investment styles. The committee remains disciplined in staying with a policy that emphasizes diversification of assets, quality investments and a long-term perspective. Both the committee and our Trustees view these responsibilities as among the most important we provide as managers of the community's endowment.

The committee hires investment managers to manage a particular style. We use seven active managers; five for equities and two for fixed income investments. Approximately 47 percent of the pooled investments are actively managed.

As endowment fund investors we have a perpetual horizon and maintain a disciplined approach to long-term investment strategy while utilizing short-term tactical allocations to add value when opportunities arise. We also remain committed to a long-term diversification strategy with an allocation to high quality fixed income assets even in times of booming equity investments. In addition, our prudent spending policy provides a structured method of making distributions from an endowment that protects the stream from inflation thus creating a predictable annual distribution and allows the Investment Committee to focus on maximizing total investment return.

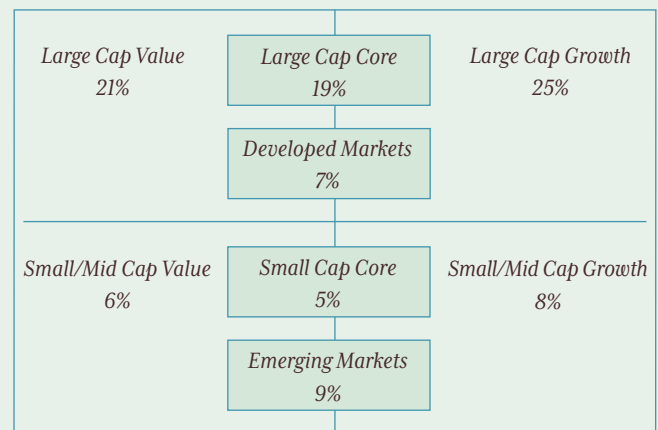

Advised Funds Can Create a Family Legacy

Advised Funds are the simplest and most flexible way for an individual or family to accomplish their charitable goals. We offer three options and each one can be established with a gift of cash or other assets.

With a minimum balance of \$20,000, a **Legacy Fund** offers both our proven investment management as well as the handling of all required reporting and administrative details. Additional benefits include:

- It's a permanent endowment with an annual spendable amount.
- Low competitive fees.
- The spendable balance allows for grants to be recommended at any time to any charitable organization within the United States.
- Donor has online access to fund and grant reports and can also make grant recommendations online.
- Anonymous grant making is available.
- Favorable tax treatment compared to private foundations.
- An expert staff is available to advise and provide all administrative support.

A **Gift Fund** is established with a minimum of \$20,000, and is a more effective alternative to commercial gift funds. Additional benefits include:

- Fund balance is completely spendable.
- Low competitive fees.

- Grants can be recommended at any time to any organization that is a public charity.
- Donor has online access to fund and grant reports and can also make grant recommendations online.
- Anonymous grant making is available.
- Favorable tax treatment compared to private foundations.
- An expert staff is available to advise and provide all administrative support.

The **Express Fund** can be established with a minimum of \$1,000 and offers the following benefits:

- Fund balance is completely spendable.
- No investment earnings are allocated to the fund.
- A nominal fee of up to 1 percent is charged on contributions at the time of each gift.
- Grants can be recommended at any time to any organization that is a public charity.
- Fund balance reports are available.
- Anonymous grant making is available.

Giving Now: Your Options

Cash Gifts: A cash contribution to the Oklahoma City Community Foundation can be in the form of cash, check, money order or a cashier's check. You can mail a cash contribution to: Oklahoma City Community Foundation, P.O. Box 1146, Oklahoma City, OK 73101-1146.

You may also make a gift with a major credit card via our secure online giving system at www.occf.org/onlinegiving.

Real Estate: Real estate may be given at appraised value. If appreciated, capital gain taxes may be avoided on the real estate appreciation if the property is contributed to a fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

Business-related Assets: We accept gifts of individually-owned business assets such as closely-held C-corp. and S-corp. stock, partnerships and LLCs.

Stocks and Bonds: Donating marketable or closely-held securities, such as stocks and bonds, offer you the ability to realize significant tax savings while maximizing your charitable contributions by providing income tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding the capital gains tax on those donated assets. We have accounts at many brokerage firms and can facilitate the transfer of donors' securities.

Oil and Gas Interests & Royalty Interests: Both oil & gas working interests and royalty interests may be donated to a fund at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.

Giving Later: Your Options

Charitable Gift Annuities: Through a charitable gift annuity (CGA), a donor makes a gift with cash or other assets, receives income for life and, at the end of the annuity, the remaining assets will go to the charitable funds at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation that have been chosen by the donor.

Bequests: With a bequest, you can designate a percentage, the residual or your entire estate to benefit an existing charitable fund and it may provide your family with substantial reductions in federal estate taxes.

Retirement Plan Assets: Retirement plan assets are subject not only to estate taxes, but also income taxes. You can use retirement plan assets to maximize your charitable contributions by establishing an advised fund.

Charitable Remainder Trusts: A charitable remainder trust allows you to place assets in a trust that pays you or a beneficiary an annual income. Upon the trust's termination, the remaining assets will benefit funds you've designated.

Life Insurance: Life insurance can be an effective means for a donor to fund a charitable giving plan without significant outlays of cash. Since life insurance generally results in a large payment at one time, this can be an ideal vehicle to involve and initiate family philanthropy with an advised fund or create an endowment for a specific charitable purpose.

Charitable Organization Endowment Funds

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation administers the nation's largest endowment program for charitable organizations. As of June 30, 2015, the end of our most recent fiscal year, there were nearly 340 nonprofits participating in our Charitable Organization Endowment Program.

Distribution from a majority of the endowment funds listed below and through page 10 is based upon a spending policy that calls for distributing 5 percent of a fund's market value over a 12-quarter period as of March 31, 2015. The total annual distribution in 2015 from these endowment funds is more than \$7.3 million.

Included in the list are eight charitable organizations that have permanent endowment funds that are Affiliated Funds. These organizations are denoted by a ■ and were established with a minimum gift of \$1 million and operate under a specific set of governing documents and structure that is approved by our Board of Trustees. In addition, the Affiliated Funds have a governing body of which a majority are appointed by our Trustees.
