## Charitable Organization Endowment Fund Distributions Unaffected by Economic Downturn

Central Oklahoma nonprofits participating in the Community Foundation's Charitable Organization Endowment program recently received a total of \$5.2 million in annual endowment distributions. Because of the Community Foundation's disciplined long-term investment strategy, the distribution amount was not affected by the economic downturn caused by COVID-19, and this year's distribution is an increase in what was given in 2019.

In addition to an increased distribution amount, nonprofits also received this year's distribution months in advance to help with current fundraising and cash flow needs that might have been affected by the pandemic.



# Disaster Relief Grants

#### \$100,000 Awarded to Four Nonprofits

In June, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation Trustees approved an additional \$100,000 in 2020 Disaster Relief Fund grants to four central Oklahoma organizations serving vulnerable populations affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

With the help of our donors, the Community Foundation has now awarded a total of \$485,750 in grants to 14 central Oklahoma organizations since the 2020 Disaster Relief Fund's creation in March.
